ST. PAUL'S COVID-19 RESPONSE

Welcome!!

During this unique time in history, services look a bit different than normal. We want to care for the whole parish during this time, and one way to care for one another is keeping each other safe.

St. Paul's leadership has decided on a plan for returning to pre-Covid worship practices in response to directions received for our Bishop. The below procedures will be updated accordingly. Please see Myron's letter to the parish.

We ask you to follow these guidelines while worshipping with us:

- **Continue Masking.** All parishioners must wear a mask to all services (as per City of Edmonton bylaw 19408). Exceptions to this include children under the age of two and those with a medical condition where wearing a mask is not possible. Masks may be removed when taking communion but must be replaced immediately following. If you do not have a mask, we have masks available in the foyer.
- **Vaccine/Booster.** Government and health authorities strongly recommend that all eligible individuals get their vaccination or booster for COVID-19 to mitigate serious outcomes from the virus and to reduce the spread of infections. This is **not required** to attend, but is recommended.
- **Experiencing Symptoms.** Cough, Sore Throat, Fever, Shortness of Breath, Loss of Taste or Smell. Whether you are vaccinated or not, you may be legally required to isolate – **Do not attend church.** If you have tested positive, please stay home and follow public health guidelines.
- **Exposure to COVID-19.** If you have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, please **do not attend church** - whether you are vaccinated or not.
- **Keep Us Informed.** Please let the Parish Office know if you have tested positive for, or been exposed to, COVID-19. Your identity will not be revealed, but this information is very important for us so that we can properly support you and safeguard the parish from outbreaks.
- **Maintain Physical Distance.** At all times, please remain a minimum of six feet (three seat spaces) from all other individuals not part of your family unit. There is tape on the floor six feet apart in multiple locations to help you maintain this distance. Please also maintain physical distance outside.
- **Listen to the Ushers.** There are ushers inside to help direct these procedures. Please heed their directions as they are helping to keep everyone safe and healthy.

Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

After these things the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." But Abram said, "O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." But the word of the LORD came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness. Then he said to him, "I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, Father, according to his command,
