There are a few places in Canada, especially in the Atlantic Provinces where it might still feel like that, but we live on the “left coast”, and here Christendom is a thing of the past. That means that most of the people around us are not Christian and do not attend church. If they think about church at all they often have negative thoughts because of our past failings.

If could remember that those around us know as much about us as we know about the beliefs and practices of the nearby Sikh Temple—very little. An attitude of curiosity and interest in the beliefs and practices of other faiths may open our eyes and hearts to the people, and deepen our own walk with the one we call LORD, in whose name we pray.
