



If you are not physically receiving Communion, you may offer this prayer:

"In union, O God, with all your faithful people gathered wherever the eucharist is celebrated this day, I offer you praise and thanksgiving for creation and all the blessings of this life, for the redemption given to us through the life, death and resurrection of Christ, and for the means of grace and the hope of glory. I pray you come into my heart, my soul and my mind. Let nothing separate me from you. May I serve you in this life until, by your grace, I come to your promised reign of justice and peace; through Christ and in the unity of the Spirit. Amen."

While communion is being administered, we respectfully ask that you keep the silence—this is a time for quiet prayer and meditation.

Holy Monday | 7:30pm Anointed: Songs for the Threshold of Holy Week

Let sacred songs and Taizé-style music anoint you as we begin Holy Week with this time of reflection. This takes place in person in the Cathedral sanctuary.

Holy Tuesday | 7:30pm Holden Evening Prayer

Holden Evening Prayer is a simple, music filled service of evening prayer that follows traditional form, using contemporary and inclusive language. Written by Marty Haugen in 1985-86 during a musical residency at Holden Village, it has been adopted worldwide.

Holy Wednesday | 7:30pm Tenebrae

The Cathedral choir and clergy lead this traditional Holy Week service in which music and scripture lead the congregation through the passion, death and resurrection of Christ.

Maundy Thursday | 12pm The Welcoming Table: Moral Action in the Real World. With Fr. Ron Culmer

Guest preacher Fr. Ron Culmer shares his experiences as part of a faith community that explores and takes on the task of making space for all at the table. The Maundy Café will serve a to-go meal after the talk.

This service ends with the stripping of the altar and the Eucharist being moved to a side altar where we can keep vigil.
