As we continue to create opportunities to serve our community, we are trusting that the Holy Spirit will use these acts of love to reveal His love and care for lost people who are desperately looking for hope and life.

#### Pastor Glenn Paddock Praise & Worship; College & Career

Wow, when you look back, what a year!

In Praise & Worship Ministries, we started out the year with only four people allowed on the Praise & Worship team, livestreaming to an empty room with half of the equipment we needed to make that happen. It was pretty rough sounding. And throughout the year we have run cables, repaired sound boards, purchased new lights and set up a second sound board in a separate room from which to broadcast online. Once we figured it out for Sundays, the youth were trained to livestream their services.

Then summer came and we moved everything outside, running cables again and purchasing a radio transmitter so we could do church in the parking lot. Again, it started out pretty rough and we learned as we went. By the end of the summer, it was running pretty smoothly. Being outside gave us the chance to set up all the new lights, cables, and sound without having to work around all the events. In September we moved everything back into the sanctuary, finally getting all the parts, cables and lights set up in there, along with a new laptop to run the keyboard with new sounds, etc., learning how to use it all effectively. We started a regular vocals-only practice on Thursday nights before band practice and got back to working with teams and having people in the building in many ways, trying to gather while still following regulations.

College & Career was back and forth, but for the most part we were able to keep something going that worked within restrictions: skating, bowling, hanging out at our place or Manhattan Beach, meals, devotionals, and sports nights, with anywhere from five to 25 people. It developed into much more of a family feel when we all got together. At the end of the year, College & Career transitioned to Pastor Bryce's oversight.

Other things to highlight: we were able to host Christian Heritage School Grad in our parking lot in June. We were also able to have people in the building in October and host Creation Ministries for a citywide event.

Personally, we renovated two bathrooms. Our oldest son entered his final year of high school and we said our final goodbyes to my mom in December. Thank you to everyone for your thoughts and prayers. Others in the church have passed away this year as well who will be greatly missed.

Moving ahead we are not where we once were, and we are not where we will be. God is on the MOVE. Recently I've sensed HIS moving and HIS hand it all of it as we keep focused on Him, continuing to build his house. As we focus on the multigenerational and multicultural aspects of our church we will see where he is leading us together as the body of Christ in 2022.

#### **Grounds and Building Maintenance**

This year we had the privilege of hiring a summer student. He cut the grass, fixed pot holes, did some painting and other odd jobs around the church. He kept busy and did a fantastic job!

We levelled out a spot along the south parking lot to create a skating rink. We purchased a tarp and with the help of the fire department we filled it with water, and with the -45 degree weather, we had a rink. Unfortunately, a couple of weeks later it warmed up to +5 degrees and it melted, creating a ridge in the middle. We were getting it fixed when the February weather turned again and we had more plus degree days and a rain, which fixed it for good. I am excited for next year, to get it started a lot earlier and, with some knowledge and better tools, we will have a great rink for the community and us to use.

In the building, we moved the youth lounge to a different room as we needed a larger room for the expanded media ministry due to Covid-19. We also began to create a room with a coffee bar feel that the youth could use as an area to hang out. It is still a work in progress.

We had to do a couple of small repairs to the aging boilers and other maintenance items that came up due to our aging building.

We also are in the process of looking into giving the sanctuary a major face lift, removing the back wall and creating full-size gymnasium. This would meet a need in our community as there is very little gym space to rent and it would give us a source of income. It also gives us a multipurpose room that could be used for all kinds of events and increases our seating capacity. In this renovation we would like to address the boiler system, the sanctuary and the foyer. We are currently in the planning stages and are getting preliminary drawings made to present to the congregation.
