

Ulukhaktok, Church of the Resurrection



Special Appeal for the Ulukhaktok, Anglican Church of the Resurrection, which serves as a space for community events, church services, baptisms, funerals, space for community groups, such as the sewing group, hymn sing, etc.

The Church (48 x 23 feet) is the only church in operation in Ulukhaktok (pop 450) and is in disrepair. The SSVP, North of 60 Project's main objective is to annually (in early May) ship a sea can of food and necessities to those in need, in several northern and Arctic communities where the cost of living is exorbitant. Other community projects can be supported, such as the Ulukhaktok church restoration. The church repairs could be done in stages. Wooden Floors: caving in.

Material needed: 36 sheets of 1 inch plywood

Carpet or flooring (1150 sq ft)

Windows: very old, cracked and some broken.

Material needed: energy efficient (for extreme weather), non opening windows with frame
