

NEWS FROM ST. ANDREW'S UNITED CHURCH Written by P. Marie Wedderburn



For the third in this year's Lenten sermon series *Disruptive Encounters with Jesus* eleven of us joined Matthew as he spoke of the disruptive encounter with Jesus in the area of Gerasa from Mark 5:1-17. This encounter with Jesus not only healed a man plagued with a legion of demons, but also disrupted the economic system of the region as the herd of pigs was drowned. Matthew left us with a couple of questions to ponder: how willing are we to disrupt our own fi-

nancial status quo for the sake of the healing of one person? and as we are all one family and it may take a village to heal one person back to wholeness, what is the cost of our own inaction?

Then for the fourth sermon for this Lent, twelve of us joined Julia as she spoke from the scripture Luke 7:36-50 where Jesus is at the home of Simon the Pharisee for supper and a woman comes in and "bathes [Jesus'] feet with her tears and to dry them with her hair. Then she continued kissing his feet and anointing them with the ointment" which she had brought with her in an alabaster jar (Luke 7:38 NRSV). Meanwhile the Pharisee is silently asking himself why Jesus is allowing this 'worthless' woman to do such things. Jesus knows what Simon is thinking and so replies that the woman has given her all and it is the Pharisee himself who has not followed the hospitality protocol of washing a visitor's feet, kissing both the visitor's cheeks, and anointing the visitor's head with oil. For those who may be considered worthless in the world are in God given grace, forgiveness, and love for Jesus knows the woman is beautiful and has given him her all. For in our encounters with Jesus our values are turned upside down as we are to give preference to those who are considered worthless in our world as Jesus did.


We also like to welcome Cindy Imler to our team. Cindy has completed the Naramata Healing Pathway as well as the Healing Touch International Certification Program.
