CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY March 22, 2022

Treasurer's report: We will make first half payments to our mission partners soon. PPP funds from last year will be pulled into the General Fund in March as we need to spend that money this year; this will help with mission payments. Mission Ed has added a line for "refugee relief" into their committee budget but haven't fully determined how to allocate this money. Our new bookkeeping service is working well for payroll, but their process for generating Picture the Bible and Among Friends reports needs some fine-tuning. A bookkeeper is on site once monthly.

NEW BUSINESS:

<u>Sustainability Pledge</u> - Pastor Dave presented a Sustainability Pledge developed by Hope for Creation. The City of River Falls, the RF school board, and UWRF have all expressed support for this pledge The pledge will also be at the local Earth Day fest on April 24, which is shaping up to be a large event. Joel Larsen (Moderator) and Rose Rude (Mission Ed chair) signed the pledge.

<u>Capital Campaign update</u> – Joel. Video was filmed last week and we are planning some small group gatherings starting after Easter. The campaign has a \$495,000 goal in order to (1) pay off our bank debt (2) redo sound systems in the sanctuary & Fellowship Hall and (3) fund a new church sign

<u>Pastor Dave's retirement</u> - his last day is May 15. We discussed ways to honor him on that day. We also discussed early steps in the search for a replacement. A search committee is being formed.

OLD BUSINESS:

<u>Church "reopening" is essentially done</u>. Easter breakfast will be in person this year and we will have two services, 9:00 and 10:30 am. Youth have two trips scheduled this summer (South Dakota Pine Ridge Reservation immersion trip and a Boundary Waters trip). Boston trip for confirmands past & present is scheduled for April 20-23, 2023.

Church van update - Delay continues due to supply issues. Our deposit was put down in July 2021

Weekly communion -We'll continue at least through the end of the program year

MINISTRY UPDATES:

<u>Christian Education</u> – (1) Collaborating with Mission Ed on a curriculum about mental health awareness & wellbeing for people in all ages & stages of life. They hope to offer program events next year. (2) We have a new, revised booklet on communion for families. An example was passed around (3) Christian Ed is planning to write an endowment grant to get a wireless microphone for use in the youth room

<u>Deacons</u> - They are planning to switch to an all gluten-free Communion bread recipe. Samples were provided. They hope to make the switch at Easter.

Discipleship did not meet

Mission Education - (1) Mental Health First Aid training is scheduled for May 11 and 18. The committee will sponsor up to 20 people to do this. Some people may be able to get professional continuing education credit for this program (2) They are discussing reviving the veterans' group (3) \$5000 has been donated and earmarked for Ukrainian relief (3) Rose is hoping to start a donation box for items for the UWRF food pantry, and will have a wish list in the bulletin (4) Planning a washcloth-and-towel collection event for the Our Neighbors' Place shower facility (5) Learning Community on solar energy planned for April 5, 6 pm at church

<u>Music</u> - Maria Jette & Mary Jo Gothmann will give a program (piano & voice) on April 3 at church. Refreshments afterward.

<u>Trustees</u> - They are installing programmable thermostats in downstairs rooms. Indoor & outdoor spring cleaning planned for April 30, 9 am-1 pm. All are invited

Welcoming - Continuing to manage coffee fellowship & welcoming schedules

<u>Pastor</u> - (1) New church directory planned for this spring. Diane Welsh is heading up the effort. Photos will be taken the last week of May and the first week of June. (2) Interns have suggested a cornhole league in the Fellowship Hall over the winter - perhaps a six-week tournament. We're in favor.

First Communion Information for Parents

When do children at First Congregational Church begin taking Communion?

There is no uniform age at First Congregational Church when children begin participating in the Lord's Supper. Some children are pre-school age, others are in elementary school, and some wait until confirmation to begin taking Communion. The Bible and church history do not give decisive guidelines about the age to begin celebrating the Lord's Supper. The decision about when people are welcome at the Lord's Table has largely been made by local worshipping communities. Our practice is to include children when they and their parents think they are ready to participate.

How will I know when my child is ready?

Some parents choose infant communion for their children. Many parents wait until their children express an interest. Typically, children are ready to participate in Communion when they start asking questions about this sacrament. One important theme of Communion is inclusion: All are welcome at the table of the Lord. If a child feels excluded, it is a good time for that child to begin participating.

My child does not yet receive Communion. Should she/he still come forward?

Yes, all people are invited to come forward to the servers at the Communion distribution time. Children who will not be communing should keep their hands folded (as opposed to reaching out). This is a signal to the pastor and deacons that the child desires a blessing.
