

## PROTOCOLS for In-Person Worship

### WHEN YOU ARRIVE:

- ◆ You are required to wear a mask and sanitize hands upon arrival.
- ◆ Offering may be placed in the plate in the centre aisle before service.
- ◆ Please maintain social distancing from others not in your own family as much as possible.
- ◆ Mask remains on throughout the service.
- ◆ Singing is allowed while wearing your mask.
- ◆ Peace is exchanged without any physical contact (except for those of the same household).

### COMMUNION SUNDAYS:

- ◆ Bread only distributed.
- ◆ Usher will direct you when it's your turn to go up alone or with your bubbled partner up the center aisle to the Presider and stop 3 ft away
- ◆ Please keep mask on.
- ◆ The host distributed at arms length & dropped into your extended arms.
- ◆ Return to your seat by side aisle, be seated, remove your mask to eat the wafer, and then replace your mask.
- ◆ If you wish to receive a blessing instead, please cross your arms so priest will know and a blessing will be given with no physical touch.

### Gathering Prayer

*Celebrant* Dear friends in Christ, during Lent we have been preparing for the celebration of our Lord's paschal mystery. On this day, our Lord Jesus Christ entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph. The people welcomed him with palms and shouts of praise, but the path before him led to self-giving, suffering, and death. Today, we greet him as our King, although we know his crown is thorns and his throne a cross. We follow him this week from the glory of the palms to the glory of the resurrection by way of the dark road of suffering and death. United with him in his suffering on the cross, may we share his resurrection and new life.
