

#### How to Use This Booklet:

Join believers around the world and throughout history by beginning and ending each day with Bible reading and prayer.

- Take out this booklet and a Bible.
- Pray through the prayers and read the Scriptures.
- Take your time! Even if you *don't feel like* praying, trust that God will honor this sacrifice of your time.
- If you can, pray and read with others.
  - \*Sections marked with an asterisk are to be said/read by a leader. Otherwise, say the texts in unison.
  - o If praying alone, no worries! Simply substitute "I" for "we" (and "me" for "us," etc.) throughout the prayers.

#### **REGARDING THE SCRIPTURE LESSONS:**

(The ACNA Daily Office Lectionary)

- If you want, you can use this lectionary in a 2-year cycle.
  - In odd-numbered years, use the 2 readings for Morning Prayer each day (divided between Morning and Evening Prayer, if you're praying twice).
  - In even-numbered years, use the 2 readings for Evening Prayer.
- Readings from the Apocrypha are in italics. You can replace them with a different lesson for the day if you'd like.
- The † symbol, when it appears in the lectionary, indicates a way to shorten that reading if desired.

#### **Confess Your Sins:**

Almighty and most merciful Father, we have erred and strayed from your ways like lost sheep.

We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts.

We have offended against your holy laws.

We have left undone those things
which we ought to have done,
and we have done those things
which we ought not to have done;
and apart from your grace, there is no health in us.

O Lord, have mercy upon us.

Spare all those who confess their faults.

Restore all those who are penitent,
 according to your promises
 declared to all people in Christ Jesus our Lord;

And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake,
 that we may now live a godly, righteous, and sober life,
 to the glory of your holy Name.

Amen.

#### \*Ask for Pardon & Peace:

Grant to your faithful people, merciful Lord, pardon and peace; that we may be cleansed from all our sins, and serve you with a quiet mind; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

#### In the MORNING:

#### Recite the Jubilate:

(Ps. 100)

O be joyful in the LORD, all you lands; \* serve the LORD with gladness, and come before his presence with a song. Be assured that the LORD, he is God; \* it is he that has made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. O go your way into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise; \* be thankful unto him, and speak good of his Name. For the LORD is gracious, his mercy is everlasting, \* and his truth endures from generation to generation.

#### In the EVENING:

#### Recite the Phos hilaron:

O gladsome light,
pure brightness of the everliving Father in heaven, \*
O Jesus Christ, holy and blessed!
Now as we come to the setting of the sun,
and our eyes behold the vesper light, \*
we sing your praises, O God:
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
You are worthy at all times to be praised by happy voices, \*
O Son of God, O Giver of Life,
and to be glorified through all the worlds.

#### In the MORNING:

#### Recite the Te Deum laudamus:

We praise you, O God, we acclaim you as Lord; \* all creation worships you, the Father everlasting. To you all angels, all the powers of heaven, \* the cherubim and seraphim, sing in endless praise: Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of power and might, \* heaven and earth are full of your glory. The glorious company of apostles praise you.\* The noble fellowship of prophets praise you. \* Throughout the world the holy Church acclaims you: Father, of majesty unbounded, your true and only Son, worthy of all praise, \* the Holy Spirit, advocate and guide.

You, Christ, are the king of glory, \*
the eternal Son of the Father.
When you took our flesh to set us free \*
you humbly chose the Virgin's womb.
You overcame the sting of death \*
and opened the kingdom of heaven to all believers.
You are seated at God's right hand in glory. \*
We believe that you will come to be our judge.
Come then, Lord, and help your people, \*
bought with the price of your own blood,
and bring us with your saints \*
to glory everlasting.

Save your people, Lord, and bless your inheritance; \* govern and uphold them now and always.

Day by day we bless you; \*
we praise your Name for ever.
Keep us today, Lord, from all sin; \*
have mercy on us, Lord, have mercy.

Lord, show us your love and mercy, \*
for we have put our trust in you.

In you, Lord, is our hope, \*
let us never be put to shame.

#### In the EVENING:

#### Recite the Magnificat:

(Lk. 1:46-55)

My soul magnifies the Lord, \* and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior; For he has regarded \* the lowliness of his handmaiden. For behold, from now on, \* all generations will call me blessed; For he that is mighty has magnified me, \* and holy is his Name. And his mercy is on those who fear him, \* throughout all generations. He has shown the strength of his arm; \* he has scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. He has brought down the mighty from their thrones, \* and has exalted the humble and meek. He has filled the hungry with good things, \* and the rich he has sent empty away. He, remembering his mercy, has helped his servant Israel, \* as he promised to our fathers, Abraham and his seed for ever. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; \* as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

#### Recite the Apostles' Creed:

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. *Amen*.

#### Pray the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy Name,
Thy kingdom come,
thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
and the power, and the glory,
for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### **Pray these Petitions:**

(The Suffrages)

If praying with a group, pray these responsively, the leader reading the first line.

- O Lord, show your mercy upon us; **And grant us your salvation**.
- O Lord, guide those who govern us; And lead us in the way of justice and truth.
- Clothe your ministers with righteousness; And let your people sing with joy.
- O Lord, save your people; And bless your inheritance.
- Give peace in our time, O Lord; And defend us by your mighty power.
- Let not the needy, O Lord, be forgotten; Nor the hope of the poor be taken away.
- Create in us clean hearts, O God;
  And take not your Holy Spirit from us.

NOTE! Unless there's a special collect for the day, you pray each Sunday's collect for the entire following week.

#### **EASTER**

#### The Third Sunday of Easter; May 1

Almighty God, you gave your only Son to be for us both a sacrifice for sin and an example of godly living: Give us grace thankfully to receive his inestimable benefits, and daily to follow the blessed steps of his most holy life; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### Saint Philip and Saint James; May 1

Almighty God, you gave to your apostles Philip and James the grace and strength to bear witness to Jesus as the way, the truth, and the life: Grant that we, being mindful of their victory of faith, may glorify in life and death the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

#### The Fourth Sunday of Easter; Good Shepherd; May 8

O God, whose Son Jesus Christ is the Good Shepherd of your people: Grant that, when we hear his voice, we may know him who calls us each by name, and follow where he leads; who, with you and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### The Fifth Sunday of Easter; May 15

Almighty God, whom truly to know is everlasting life: Grant us so perfectly to know your Son Jesus Christ to be the way, the truth, and the life, that we may steadfastly follow his steps in the way that leads to eternal glory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### The Sixth Sunday of Easter; Rogation; May 22

O God, you have prepared for those who love you such good things as surpass our understanding: Pour into our hearts such love towards you, that we, loving you in all things and above all things, may obtain your promises, which exceed all that we can desire; through Jesus

Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of this week are the traditional Rogation Days.

#### Ascension Day; May 26

Almighty God, whose only-begotten Son our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven: May our hearts and minds also there ascend, and with him continually dwell; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

The Collect for Ascension Day, with the corresponding psalm and lessons, also serves for the Friday and Saturday following, except as otherwise appointed

#### The Sunday after the Ascension; May 29 (use until June 4)

O God, the King of glory, you have exalted your only Son Jesus Christ with great triumph to your kingdom in heaven: Do not leave us comfortless, but send us your Holy Spirit to strengthen us, and exalt us to that place where our Savior Christ has gone before; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, in glory everlasting. *Amen.* 

#### The Visitation; May 31

Almighty God, by whose grace Elizabeth rejoiced with the blessed Virgin Mary and greeted her as the mother of the Lord: Look with favor on your lowly servants, that, with Mary, we may magnify your holy Name and rejoice to acclaim her Son as our Savior; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.* 

#### Day of Pentecost; Whitsunday; June 5

Almighty God, on this day, through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, you revealed the way of eternal life to every race and nation: Pour out this gift anew, that by the preaching of the Gospel your salvation may reach to the ends of the earth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.* 

or this

O God, who on this day taught the hearts of your faithful people by sending to them the light of your Holy Spirit: Grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgment in all things, and evermore to rejoice in his holy comfort; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.* 

The Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday of this week are the traditional summer Ember Days.

#### Saint Barnabas; June 11

Grant, O God, that we may follow the example of your faithful servant Barnabas, who, seeking not his own renown but the well-being of your Church, gave generously of his life and substance for the relief of the poor, and went forth courageously in mission for the spread of the Gospel; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### AFTER PENTECOST

#### Trinity Sunday; June 12

Almighty and everlasting God, you have given to us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity, and in the power of your divine Majesty to worship the Unity: Keep us steadfast in this faith and worship, and bring us at last to see you in your one and eternal glory, O Father; who with the Son and the Holy Spirit live and reign, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.* 

#### Second Sunday after Pentecost; June 19

Lord of all power and might, the author and giver of all good things: Graft in our hearts the love of your Name, increase in us true religion, nourish us with all goodness, and bring forth in us the fruit of good works; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist; June 24

Almighty God, by whose providence your servant John the Baptist was wonderfully born, and sent to prepare the way of your Son our Savior by preaching repentance: Make us so to follow his teaching and holy life, that we may truly repent, boldly rebuke vice, patiently suffer for the sake of truth, and proclaim the coming of Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.* 

#### Third Sunday after Pentecost; June 26

O God, your never-failing providence sets in order all things both in heaven and on earth: Put away from us all hurtful things, and give us those things that are profitable for us; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

#### Saint Peter and Saint Paul; June 29

Almighty God, whose blessed apostles Peter and Paul glorified you by their martyrdom: Grant that your Church, instructed by their teaching and example, and knit together in unity by your Spirit, may ever stand firm upon the one foundation, which is Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

#### The Fourth Sunday after Pentecost; July 3

Grant us, O Lord, we pray, the spirit to think and do always those things that are right, that we, who can do no good thing apart from you, may by you be enabled to live according to your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### The Fifth Sunday after Pentecost; July 10

Let your merciful ears, O Lord, be open to the prayers of your humble servants; and, that we may receive what we ask, teach us by your Holy Spirit to ask only those things that are pleasing to you; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the same Spirit lives and reigns for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### The Sixth Sunday after Pentecost; July 17

O God, you declare your almighty power chiefly in showing mercy and pity: Grant us the fullness of your grace, that we, running to obtain your promises, may become partakers of your heavenly treasure; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### Saint Mary Magdalene; July 22

Almighty God, whose blessed Son restored Mary Magdalene to health of body and of mind, and called her to be a witness of his resurrection: Mercifully grant that, by your grace, we may be healed from all our infirmities and know you in the power of his unending life; who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.* 

#### The Seventh Sunday after Pentecost; July 24

Almighty and everlasting God, you are always more ready to hear than we to pray, and to give more than we either desire or deserve: Pour down upon us the abundance of your mercy, forgiving us those things of which our conscience is afraid, and giving us those good things for which we are not worthy to ask, except through the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ our Savior; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### Saint James; July 25

O gracious God, your servant and apostle James was first among the Twelve to suffer martyrdom for the Name of Jesus Christ: Pour out upon the leaders of your Church that spirit of self-denying service, by which they may have true authority among your people; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

#### The Eighth Sunday after Pentecost; July 31

Almighty and merciful God, it is only by your grace that your faithful people offer you true and laudable service: Grant that we may run without stumbling to obtain your heavenly promises; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

#### The Transfiguration; August 6

O God, who on the holy mount revealed to chosen witnesses your well-beloved Son, wonderfully transfigured, in raiment white and glistening: Mercifully grant that we, being delivered from the disquietude of this world, may by faith behold the King in his beauty; who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

#### The Ninth Sunday after Pentecost; August 7

Almighty God, give us the increase of faith, hope, and love; and, that we may obtain what you have promised, make us love what you command; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### The Tenth Sunday After Pentecost; August 14

Keep your Church, O Lord, by your perpetual mercy; and because without you the frailty of our nature causes us to fall, keep us from all things hurtful, and lead us to all things profitable for our salvation; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### Saint Mary the Virgin; August 15

O God, you have taken to yourself the blessed Virgin Mary, mother of your incarnate Son: Grant that we, who have been redeemed by his blood, may share with her the glory of your eternal kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

#### The Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost; August 21

Let your continual mercy, O Lord, cleanse and defend your Church; and, because it cannot continue in safety without your help, protect and govern it always by your goodness; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### Saint Bartholomew; August 24

Almighty and everlasting God, you gave your apostle Bartholomew grace truly to believe and to preach your Word: Grant that your Church may love what he believed and preach what he taught; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### The Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost; August 28

O Lord, we pray that your grace may always precede and follow after us, that we may continually be given to good works; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

#### \*In the MORNING:

#### Pray for Peace & Grace:

O God, the author of peace and lover of concord, to know you is eternal life and to serve you is perfect freedom: Defend us, your humble servants, in all assaults of our enemies; that we, surely trusting in your defense, may not fear the power of any adversaries, through the might of Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.* 

O Lord, our heavenly Father, almighty and everlasting God, you have brought us safely to the beginning of this day: Defend us by your mighty power, that we may not fall into sin nor run into any danger; and that guided by your Spirit, we may do what is righteous in your sight; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.* 

#### \*In the EVENING:

#### Pray for Peace & Protection:

O God, the source of all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works: Give to your servants that peace which the world cannot give, that our hearts may be set to obey your commandments, and that we, being defended from the fear of our enemies, may pass our time in rest and quietness, through the merits of Jesus Christ our Savior. *Amen*.

Lighten our darkness, we beseech you, O Lord; and by your great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of your only Son, our Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen*.

#### \*Collects for Mission

#### \*In the MORNING, pray one of the following:

Almighty and everlasting God, who alone works great marvels: Send down upon our clergy and the congregations committed to their charge the life-giving Spirit of your grace, shower them with the continual dew of your blessing, and ignite in them a zealous love of your Gospel; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

O God, you have made of one blood all the peoples of the earth, and sent your blessed Son to preach peace to those who are far off and to those who are near: Grant that people everywhere may seek after you and find you; bring the nations into your fold; pour out your Spirit upon all flesh; and hasten the coming of your kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

Lord Jesus Christ, you stretched out your arms of love on the hard wood of the Cross that everyone might come within the reach of your saving embrace: So clothe us in your Spirit that we, reaching forth our hands in love, may bring those who do not know you to the knowledge and love of you; for the honor of your Name. *Amen*.

#### \*In the EVENING, pray one of the following:

O God and Father of all, whom the whole heavens adore: Let the whole earth also worship you, all nations obey you, all tongues confess and bless you, and men, women, and children everywhere love you and serve you in peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. *Amen.* 

O God, you manifest in your servants the signs of your presence: Send forth upon us the Spirit of love, that in companionship with one another your abounding grace may increase among us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.
