When everyone has been served we will eat and drink together. If you are unable to come forward, please notify an elder and they will bring communion to you.

The Service of Tenebrae

Tenebrae is a Latin word meaning "shadows." It is a fourth century Holy Week service for the commemoration of the passion and death of Christ. As the scriptural narrative unfolds, the extinguishing of the candles symbolizes the disciples' denials and the world's resentment, which led to the isolation and death of Jesus on the cross. The darkness increases and the Christ candle is removed. There are 33 tolls of the bell for each year of Jesus' earthly life. We remain in silence until we have exited the sanctuary.
