THE SIDE EFFECTS OF LIFE

John 16:33 (NIV) "In this world you will have trouble."

1 Corinthians 13:12 (NLT) "Now we see things imperfectly as in a poor mirror, but then we will see everything with perfect clarity. All that I know now is partial and incomplete, but then I will know everything completely, just as God knows me now."

POINTS OF LIGHT: Through the Fog of Suffering and Pain

LIGHT #1 - God is not the CREATOR of evil and suffering.

Genesis 1:31 (NASB) God saw all that He had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

Two Kinds of Evil

• MORAL evil.

Romans 3:23 (CEV) "All of us have sinned. All of us have fallen short of the glory of God."

• NATURAL evil.

Romans 8:22 (TEV) "For we know that up to the present time all of creation groans with pain like the pain of childbirth."

LIGHT #2 - Although suffering is not good, God can use it to ACCOMPLISH good.

How does this happen?

- 1. God uses pain to **DRAW** people toward Jesus.
- 2 Corinthians 7:10 (TLB) "For God sometimes uses sorrow in our lives to help us turn away from sin and seek eternal life. We should never regret His sending it."
- 2. God uses pain to **SHARPEN** our character, to help His children become more like Christ.

Romans 5:3 (ESV) *Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance,* ⁴ *and endurance produces character, and character produces hope...*

Hebrews 5:8 (TEV) "Even though He was God's Son He learned to be obedient because of His sufferings."

3. God uses pain to lovingly **DISCIPLINE** His children for their own good so they might learn the right path to take.

Hebrews 12:10 (NLT) For our earthly fathers disciplined us for a few years, doing the best they knew how. But God's discipline is always good for us, so that we might share in His holiness. ¹¹ No discipline is enjoyable while it is happening - it's painful! But afterward there will be a peaceful harvest of right living for those who are trained in this way.

Romans 8:28 (NASB) And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose.

Genesis 50:20 (NIV) "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives."

LIGHT #3 - The day is **COMING** when suffering will cease and evil will be judged.

2 Peter 3:9 (NIV) The Lord is not slow in keeping His promise, as some understand slowness. Instead He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.

LIGHT #4 - Our suffering will pale in COMPARISON to what God has in store for His followers.

2 Corinthians 4:17 (NIV) "For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all."

Romans 8:18 (NIV) I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us.

1 Corinthians 2:9 (NLT) "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no mind has conceived what God has prepared for those who love Him."

LIGHT #5 - We <u>CHOOSE</u> whether to turn bitter or turn to God for peace and courage.

John 16:33 (NASB) "These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation but take courage. I have overcome the world."

The ultimate answer of God to this question of suffering is not an <u>EXPLANATION</u>, it is the <u>INCARNATION</u> – Jesus Christ fully God and fully man, coming in to our experience to live and die for us.

Psalm 34:18 (NIV) "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."
