As we go into the coming week let us daily pray;

Giving thanks to our gracious God for God-fearing mothers without whom many of us would not have had the nurture in the faith that now sustains us.

Charm is deceitful, and beauty is vain, but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised. (Proverbs 31:30 NRSV)

- ⇒ Give praise and thanks to God for creating us man and woman each designed to complement the other and provide the right environment to raise a family.
- ⇒ Please pray for those among us and our families who suffer the ravages of cancer. Give thanks for healing mercies where healing has occurred and pray for healing for those still struggling with its effects.
- ⇒ Give thanks to God for the wonderful Selah evening we had last Sunday where the presence of the Lord was felt in a very tangible and moving way.
- ⇒ Please pray that the decisions made at the synod meeting were those pleasing to the Lord and that whatever flows from it will be of great benefit for the denomination.
- ⇒ Please continue to pray for our nation, that the Lord will bring about situations that will cause many to turn back to him.
- ⇒ Please continue to pray for the situation in Ukraine, pray that the Lord will bring a swift and just end to this conflict.

Please continue to pray for our brothers and sisters in Afghanistan. Christian ministries have lost contact with numerous partners in Afghanistan as the embattled country enters a "new phase" of the crisis sparked by the Taliban takeover, the head of a U.S. based ministry has said. William Stark, International Christian Concern's regional manager for South Asia, told The Christian Post that when the Taliban took control of much of Afghanistan following the drawing down of U.S. troops in August, many ministries working with the country's underground church worked tirelessly to evacuate at-risk Christians. Now, as Christians trapped in the country face an uncertain future, many have gone silent, desperately seeking to avoid the probing eyes of the Taliban. "Christians are now in hiding because of active threats against their community," Stark said. He shared stories of how Christians continue to face threats from members of the Taliban.

In one situation, an Islamic extremist threatened to kidnap a Christian man's daughters and marry them off to the Taliban. In another, a Christian man received a letter from the Taliban saying his house belonged to them. Christians are also warned to refrain from gathering. "Within the networks that we have, a number of people have changed their phone numbers because it's not safe anymore," Stark said. "Their work to lie low in the country makes it hard for someone on the outside to stay in contact." Many estimate the Christian population in Afghanistan to be as many as 12,000, making it one of the country's largest religious minorities. Afghanistan is over 99% Muslim. Though all religious minorities in Afghanistan are at risk, Christians are particularly so, Stark said, because the vast majority of them have converted to Christianity from Islam. Under Sharia law, leaving Islam is a crime punishable by death.

"We talk about Christians as a religious minority, but to the Taliban, they're seen as apostates, criminals and people that deserve to be punished," Stark explained. As persecution continues to increase, Afghan Christians need "help from the outside" to escape their circumstances, he said. "It's going to take a diplomatic process by the U.S., the U.K. and other countries that are going to allow them to leave that country," he said. "Essentially, what they need is some sort of special status that would allow them to travel outside of Afghanistan." Many Afghan Christians are "rural, uneducated and don't have a passport," he added, so many of

them are unable to acquire the documents needed to leave the country.

Pray for the Prophetic voice of encouragement to come alongside those standing for election, that they would speak truth in all their utterances.

Scripture – Isaiah 60:1-2

Day 3 – Wednesday 11 May

For there is one mediator between God and Mankind, the man Jesus Christ - Remember in our prayers that Jesus gave His life for all mankind. Give thanksgiving and praise that Jesus gave himself as ransom for those standing for election. Pray for the salvation of all those who seek to serve us that they will not reject 'the truth' that Jesus gave His life for them. Pray that in the lead up to the elections many Leaders and Candidates who believe would publicly confess their faith in Jesus as Lord.

Scripture - Hebrews 9:11-15

Day 4 - Thursday 12 May

Do nothing out of selfish ambition and vain conceit but in humility consider others better than yourselves — Pray that those seeking public office would walk in humility not pride as they prepare to serve our Nation of Australia. Pray that Leaders & Candidates will live in love, humility & service to one another. That they be unified as one in purpose for the betterment of our nation.

Day 5 - Friday 13 May

Praying for the character of God to emerge in those standing for election -Pray for electoral success for all Leaders and Candidates who are prepared to walk in righteousness and justice. Pray that they would recognise the need to be in right standing with God in personal moral, spiritual, and relationship issues. Pray they would be faithful, thoughtful and wise as the Lord places them in strategic areas to serve our Nation.

Scripture - 1 Corinthians 13:1-9a

Day 6 – Saturday 14 May

Immersing all candidates in His love – Read today's scripture and pray that all who are standing for election would exhibit the qualities of love outlined in verses 4 to 7.

Session Chair's monthly update for March 2022

I'm a bit late this month – I've been catching up with life after being away all March.

CHRIS

March was again a busy month for Chris, catching up after a short break. Some of his activities were:

Training/Equipping:

Chris started a training course with deacons on being the hands and feet of Jesus.

He also continued training with the pastoral care team and elders on Gospel centred counselling. And, of course, Chris continued preaching through the Garden to Garden City series.

Pastoral care:

Chris made 10 pastoral visits and contacts during the month, started pre-marriage counselling with a new couple and conducted the baptism of Thomas Trigg. He also ran or attended a small group on 3 occasions and met one on one with two people to disciple them. He also ran the Youth group and started to put together a team for the church camp

Ministry Development:

Chris regularly meets with elders and ministry coordinators for coaching and ministry development. During this month he had meetings with 3 elders and one coordinator.

He also me with Jack De Vries, our denominations ministry development coach to discuss various denomination programs, particularly around raising up new gospel workers.

Chris also had a meeting with the Victorian Director of Scripture Union.

Denominational involvement:

He ran the Reformed Churches Youth Committee meeting – this committee meets once a term to discuss ways to improve and stimulate ministry to youth and young adults.

Along with Kasha Schubert, Chris met with the Victorian CRCA State Youth Committee.

Classis is the area gathering for Christian Reformed Churches; it's more a cooperative than a hierarchy. Our classis covers Melbourne and western Victoria. During March, Chris attending our Classis meeting in Geelong.

Other:

During the month, Chris also contracted Covid, which meant he had to record and edit one sermon for a "live" recorded showing in church. By the way, don't underestimate the time it takes to edit a sermon – sounds simple, but takes a lot of time.

DEACONS

The deacons continue to be thankful for the great support to their work with the Dining Room Mission, both in terms of the great food that has been cooked for the mission and the monetary support that allows them to do it. If you would like to be involved, talk to one of the deacons - they would love to hear from you and they have some large casserole dishes at the church that could be used for these meals.

They continue to support people in our congregation. Again, they would love to hear from anyone in the congregation and friends of theirs, who could use a little help.

FACILITIES MANAGEMENT

The playground equipment has been repaired and timber stained. The removal of a fallen tree is pending ac-

ceptance of the insurance claim.

KIDS HOPE

This is in a transitional phase as Ené hands over to Dale who is attending a coordinator course on Wednesday. Sandra and Lorenz have retired from mentoring, and the team will be seeking new volunteers once the needs of the school have been determined.

YOUNG ADULTS

Young adults is going very well. Over the past month they have been working through the resource entitled "The Course of Your Life" - which has been very beneficial. It's been great to see that everyone is enjoying this and is growing in their faith. They have also been looking through the book of Philippians on alternating weeks.

They have had a few social nights to catch up, even though they catch up weekly - but in a more relaxed approach where they can share a meal and play board/card games on these nights.

CHILDRENS MINISTRY

Sunday School is going really well, the curriculum is engaging and there are plenty of helpers. There is a small group of regulars which is nice. Sunday school will run over the holidays but will be scaled down and was adapted over Easter.

AUDIO/VISUAL

The team are doing well and are thankful to those who have stepped up and are now assisting. They do still need more volunteers to share the load so please consider joining.

MUSIC MINISTRY

The music team continues to be delighted to support the congregations worship through song. They have been delighted to welcome, or welcome back, some extra people. However, the team lost several people who moved to the country or interstate. So, with just a handful of singers, shortly just 2 pianists, 2 guitarists and one flute player, and with the additional songs for the Easter services and the monthly Selah evenings, the workload continues to increase. Anyone who is able to help out even occasionally would be warmly welcomed. An extra pianist or two would be especially welcome, and the team can arrange things to provide the necessary support.
