We love to travel (especially where there is good food), movies, and one of my passions is photography. The church received an email before Easter asking what scriptures we as Lutherans base our salvation, especially baptism. I have been pondering how to respond to his questions. I'd like to think I know what and how I believe regarding my salvation and the beauty of my baptism. However, putting that in writing to someone I know nothing about or know nothing of his faith, has given me pause. I decided it was time to reread old materials to find the right words.

I turned to the Daniel Erlander books "Let the Children Come" and "Baptized We Live, Lutheranism as a Way of Life". One of the first things I read was that many Lutherans seem to have a difficult time explaining what a being a Lutheran means. Well, that's why I started reading this book again! Mr. Erlander tells us that Lutheranism is a WAY – a way of seeing, a way of hearing, a way of teaching, and a way of following.

The cross in almost every Lutheran worship room is the symbol that reminds us that we don't find God. God finds us – wherever we are – in our pain, our emptiness, our loneliness, or our weakness. The Holy Spirit opens our eyes to see the cross as God's Embrace and God's Victory. We celebrate that glorious fact through our worship services at both Christmas and Easter. Both give us a beautiful picture of the way God comes to us, hidden in flesh, in weakness, and in poverty.

As Lutherans, we say that Christ is present in the bread and wine of communion and the water of baptism because Christ is present in all of creation. These sacraments are unique because of the promise of God connected to the physical element and the human action — eating, drinking, and washing. In the baptismal water we died with Christ, claiming us for a life of total obedience to Jesus Christ. Through our baptism, we are Christians, a status that never depends on how we feel, having the right experience, being free of doubts, or our success. We are Christians because God surprised us. Through the water, God has washed us and grafted us into Christ. Jesus' story becomes our story. Baptized into his death, we are raised to live as the Body of Christ in the world.

Luther rejoiced in the gift of baptism because in ordinary water, when Christ's promise is present, there God is present. In baptism, God delivers us from sin, death, and the devil, giving us all the benefits of God's Kingdom – the glorious exchange as I learned in my training. Also, we are given a new way of life – a daily pattern of returning to the waters of baptism, dying to our old self, and being raised into a new life in Christ. This daily dying and rising are both a gift and an experience which happens any time, anywhere.

Martin Luther said "Baptism is so full of comfort and grace that heaven and earth cannot comprehend it. It promises and brings the entire Christ! The blessings of baptism are boundless. No greater jewel can adorn our body and soul than baptism, for through it we obtain perfect holiness and salvation."



We have committed \$7 million to respond to this crisis, and we expect to increase this amount as we secure additional funding.

Our Humanitarian Action team is working with partners to implement programming based on short and long-term needs in Poland and in Ukraine. We have deployed additional technical staff to support our relief operations, including a program manager, a health advisor, and an advisor to lead our efforts to prevent sexual exploitation and abuse in Ukraine and for Ukrainian refugees.

Our response in Ukraine includes:

- · Medical supplies and equipment. We are supporting health facilities in Ukraine in partnership with the Order of Malta by providing supplies, including surgical and wound care kits, gauze, IV kits, oxygen masks, defibrillators and stretchers.
- · Partnerships with networks throughout Ukraine to provide shelter. We are partnering with networks in Ukraine to provide ongoing support to six facilities that are being used to shelter internally displaced persons. We're providing food and essential supplies and equipment, like folding beds, pillows, heaters, laundry detergent, toilet paper, and personal hygiene items. In all, we'll offer nearly 60,000 nights of shelter for people who need a place to stay.
- · Identifying key gaps in the availability of services. We are designing an assessment process to identify key gaps in the availability of health services related to genderbased violence, mental health services and psychosocial services and communicable diseases. This work will be used to inform our response to support the Ministry of Health and other health care providers in Ukraine.

Our response in Poland includes:

- · Emergency cash and vouchers for Ukrainian refugees in Poland. We've committed \$2 million to this effort in a combined program with Lutheran World Federation (LWF) that will support an initial caseload of more than 1,300 refugee families for the next three months.
- · Protection from Sexual Exploitation and Abuse: We're integrating a referral system at our cash distribution sites in Poland so refugee women and children can safely and easily access protection services. We are an active member of the Regional Gender Task Force for Ukraine response, which is co-chaired by UN Women and Care International.
- Ongoing support for the Evangelical-Augsburg Church of St. Martin in Krakow, Poland, which has established a hostel for Ukrainian women and children. We have provided essential supplies including milk, energy biscuits, personal hygiene products and room partition panels. We will continue to support the church to expand its relief operations in coordination with LWF.
- · Shipping and distributing LWR Quilts and Care Kits in partnership with local organizations.

We are grateful for the thousands of Lutherans across the United States whose care and generosity have made it possible for us to respond immediately. At this time, financial gifts are the number one need to assist refugees on the move.


