**First Reading** *Acts 11:1-18*

**Pew Bible, New Testament p. 99**

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we

entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

## Notice to St. Paul's Patrons – **Traffic Disruptions**

The City has started construction for phase 2 of the "Downtown Loop" project. This construction may affect your traffic route especially if you travel west along Queen's Ave. from St. Paul's.

### **Traffic changes**

The following traffic restrictions will be in place:

1. Ridout Street North between Fullarton Street and Queens Avenue will be closed to all road users;
2. both Queens Avenue from Talbot Street to Ridout Street, and Ridout Street North between Queens Avenue and King Street will experience temporary lane restrictions; and
3. temporary traffic diversions will be implemented for Dundas Place.

These road closures and restrictions are expected to be in place for around four months. The areas of Queens Avenue undergoing construction will shift as work progresses easterly this year, which will require closures and restrictions in the months ahead.

SUGGESTION ... if Queens Ave. is clogged, travel north to Oxford Street or south to York Street then west.
