when life is overwhelming and confusing—


and, using the **Psalms** as an ancient inner road-map,



NEWS FROM ST. ANDREW'S UNITED CHURCH

First of all, our thanks go to Bonnie for organizing the Plant Sale and also to those who gathered at Okotoks United on May 11th for the delivery of the hanging baskets to those who purchased the baskets. I hope that the plants are doing well. Secondly, we express our thanks to Shirle for organizing this year's

garage sale and for all those who donated items for it and most importantly to all those who worked before, during, and after the sale. We are indeed a caring community of faith.

And speaking of being a caring community of faith, let us continue to pray for those who gather with us each Sunday as well as those who cannot for whatever reason gather in-person with us each Sunday.

The Fourth Sunday of Easter (May 8th) saw fifteen of us join with Julia as we began the sermon series *Where Do We Go From Here?* This series of messages is based on the Psalms and on this Sunday we heard Psalm 12, one of the Psalms not regularly heard. This Psalm expresses the psalmist anger and Julia spoke of what anger can do in our lives if we do not learn to express our anger in healthy ways. Our feelings and emotions show us who we are. We should not ignore our emotions including anger but rather it is how we respond to our emotions that becomes a potent teacher that can promote appropriate boundaries, confront injustice and help those who ache. Julia asked, "What makes you angry and how do you respond to that anger?" For between the stimulus (of our anger) and our response (to our anger) there is a space and how we respond is in that space.

On the Fifth Sunday of Easter (May 15th), seventeen of us gathered with Julia as she continued in the sermon series *Where Do We Go From Here?* As Psalm 42 is included in *Voices United*, we read this Psalm responsively. Julia spoke of how we deny pain and pretend all is well. Today's society tends to pursue happiness, a good life, and success. This leads to the tendency to avoid dealing with our losses and disappointments. So perhaps the most healthy place to go from here is grief. Dealing with the losses and disappointments in our lives takes time and intention as we reflect on what the losses and disappointments meant to us as individuals. For unresolved losses change our lives but working through our losses can end with hope. I would encourage us to reread Psalm 42.
