Dear Friends:

I have read with interest the report from the October 13<sup>th</sup> Transition Meeting, and watched the videos. I am aware the question of same-sex marriage was raised. Bishop Logan spoke to his hope that the next permanent incumbent would be a priest who can come in and minister to those who have different understandings of God, the Church and faith; someone who can embrace the diocesan vision of reconciliation and beyond; someone who can see that diversity is part of human nature and is a gift from God; but who can also see that unity in diversity is our aim, not uniformity in beliefs. My experience so far in this parish affirms absolutely the need for an incumbent who is able to be pastor to parishioners who hold opposing views.

We all know that this question is not going to go away. Some would prefer never to talk about it. Others are weary of the tensions that it can generate. Still others cannot understand what the problem is. Let me remind you that we are defined as Christians not by this sometimes troubling conversation, but by our baptism; we are sustained by our faith in Jesus Christ, and every one of us is nurtured at the same holy table.

Bishop Logan believes that another facilitated gathering is necessary to help the parish move forward into the years ahead. I think he is right; my perception so far is that before the parish can go out and advertise for an ordained person to join our ministry, more rather than less conversation and mutual understanding is needed.

To facilitate some of this conversation, you are invited to attend a gathering on Saturday, December 9<sup>th</sup> from 9:00am to 2:00pm at St. Mary's. Please bring a bag lunch. The day will be

held in the context of a Eucharist beginning with the Word and ending with the sharing of bread and wine. This time together would help members to listen to one another. This would not be a legislative process and it would certainly not end up with the taking of a vote.

Please make every effort to attend this important time together. The outline for the day is printed below.
