
May all who share your abundant gifts be incorporated as one body and one holy people, joined in the offering of Jesus' birth, life, death and resurrection for the reconciliation of all things.

READER Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church.

ALL Thanks be to God.

²⁵Yonder is the great and wide sea with its living things
too many to number, *

creatures both small and great.

²⁶There move the ships, and there is that Leviathan, *

which you have made for the sport of it.

²⁷All of them look to you *

to give them their food in due season.

²⁸You give it to them; they gather it; *

**you open your hand, and they are filled with
good things.**

²⁹You hide your face, and they are terrified; *

**you take away their breath, and they die and
return to their dust.**

³⁰You send forth your Spirit, and they are created; *

and so you renew the face of the earth.

³¹May your glory, O Lord, endure for ever; *

may you rejoice in all these works;

³²you look at the earth and it trembles; *
