God's Holy Spirit breathes in and through us.







The Rev. Jeffrey Preiss Silence for Reflection

Presider

Let us confess our faith, as we say,

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit

he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,

and his kingdom will have no end.

Music Notes

Pierick Houdy is a French composer (naturalised Canadian), born in Rennes January 18, 1929.

He died quite recently at the grand age of 92 - March 22, 2021.

Student of Maurice Duruflé, Nadia Boulanger, Olivier Messiaen and Darius Milhaud at the Paris Conservatoire, Houdy obtained a first prize for composition, then the second Prix de Rome and the Grand Prize of the City of Paris.


He was director of the Conservatory of Tours in 1955, choirmaster of the church of St. Séverin in Paris (1965), choirmaster of the Masters Children Radio France (1966). From 1970 he taught composition in Quebec, at Laval University and the Conservatory of Music.

He returned to France in 1992, where he continued to teach composition.

A prolific composer, he wrote in a wide variety of styles and genres including a Mass for children's voices.

La Messe Quebeçoise - written while he lived in Canada is for mixed voices, violin, organ, bass & spoons 1972.

It won the Grand Prix du Disque Canada - London Records - in 1978.
