**We love you and adore you.**


What delight you have in the Son,

## Preparing for Confession

# *Reflection Time*

## The 1<sup>st</sup> Reading is from Proverbs 8.1-4, 22-31

- 1 Does not wisdom call,  
and does not understanding raise her voice?
- 2 On the heights, beside the way,  
at the crossroads she takes her stand;
- 3 beside the gates in front of the town,  
at the entrance of the portals she cries out:
- 4 'To you, O people, I call,  
and my cry is to all that live.
- 22 The Lord created me at the beginning of his work,  
the first of his acts of long ago.
- 23 Ages ago I was set up,  
at the first, before the beginning of the earth.
- 24 When there were no depths I was brought forth,  
when there were no springs abounding with water.
- 25 Before the mountains had been shaped,  
before the hills, I was brought forth—
- 26 when he had not yet made earth and fields,  
or the world's first bits of soil.

**27** When he established the heavens, I was there,  
when he drew a circle on the face of the deep,  
**28** when he made firm the skies above,  
when he established the fountains of the deep,  
**29** when he assigned to the sea its limit,  
so that the waters might not transgress his command,  
when he marked out the foundations of the earth,  
**30** then I was beside him, like a master worker;  
and I was daily his delight,  
rejoicing before him always,  
**31** rejoicing in his inhabited world  
and delighting in the human race.

**1** Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, **2** through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. **3** And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, **4** and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, **5** and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

*This is the Gospel of the Lord. All: Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.*


