We are committed to providing our Sunday Service, and some events and meetings, by zoom as well as in-person. The zoom link for Sunday services is sent each week by email but it is always the same link. If you would like to be included in the email please let the office know.

We have now reached a further stage of integration in our hybrid services; people who attend by zoom are now able to participate as reader or to share announcements at the end of the service.

The transition process continues. Please pray for our search committee chaired by Rick Monchak. When the search process has reached a point where they have chosen someone to be the next rector they will notify the bishop who will arrange for the position to be offered to the candidate. If the candidate accepts the position, it will be announced on an agreed Sunday morning both here and in the candidate's parish or other place of employment. Due to the confidentiality of the process, there is no further information to share at this point.

**COVID News:** The medical health officer and our bishop have set boundaries for some of our activities. We are doing as we are encouraged and asking people to wear masks in worship. We have decided not to return to the Common Cup yet. Please be careful, respectful, and kind.


