Even after we are made new by Christ, what are some ways that you still struggle with the world, the flesh, or the Devil?

In light of Ephesians 2:1-3, what would the rest of your life look like if God hadn't rescued you from your sin?

After the Apostle Paul reminded the church of their former state, he reminded them of who they now were in Christ. In Ephesians 2:5, what does it mean to be made alive with Christ?

According to verse 9, why is it so important that we understand our rescue as a gift of grace?

In Ephesians 2:10, we are said to be Christ's workmanship. What should that look like in the life of a believer?

In contrast to Ephesians 2:10, our culture tells us that we can become anything we want to become. How does this mindset subtly creep into your walk with God?

We often seek to control our future; why do we struggle with entrusting this to Christ?

God can do so much more with our life than we are capable of in our own power, how would your life be different if you truly believed Jesus wanted to make you His masterpiece?
