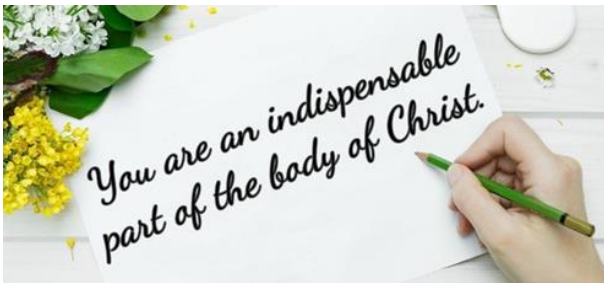

On August 14th we are going to have a celebration in honour of Rev. Shirley's retirement and her years of service at St. Luke's. The morning service of Holy Eucharist will be at Christ Church. At 12:30 we will gather at St. Luke's Hall for a shared lunch. See you there!

Emergency Building Repairs

In recent months, our Building Committee has determined that there are two emergency repair projects needing to be done on St. Luke's building, namely, cracks in the foundation and rot in the bell tower. Our vestry agreed to explore the cost and the scope of work.

Last week wardens Nancy English and John Wetmore met with Ian Hatfield of Peak Construction. He has agreed to take on the **Steeple Repair Project**. He expects the job to take about a week and he will do it in September of this year. The estimate for this job is \$50,000. This includes sufficient contingency to address anything unforeseen once he starts. He will repair the rotted timber that is part of the top plate on the southeast corner of the bell tower, repair any roof damage and replace all of the shingles on the steeple above and below the bell.



Duane Giberson has agreed to repair the damage to the **Stone Foundation** of the church on the northeast corner next to the Hall. This work will be done this fall. The estimate for this job is \$3000.

Now that we know we need \$53,000 to carry out these repairs, we must turn our attention to raising the necessary funds. This will mean employing a number of strategies. We need as much help as we can get, so be thinking of as many ways and people needed to get this done.

This will be discussed at our vestry meeting on June 26, with some decisions made regarding fundraising for this and future projects, which we will share in the days ahead. Your support of this work is greatly appreciated. We hope and pray that St. Luke's will stand as a beacon of hope in our community for many years to come.
