ON THIS DAY IN AMERICAN HISTORY!

Creating the Declaration of Independence


Mention the Declaration of Independence to many people familiar with American history, and the picture which comes to mind is that of the parchment document hanging in the Smithsonian. Sadly, many lack any real knowledge of its creation.

During the Second Continental Congress, the Committee of Five was assigned the task of drafting the document which would become the Declaration. Composed of John Adams (MA), Benjamin Franklin (PA), Thomas Jefferson (VA), Robert Livingston (NY) and Roger Sherman (CT), the Committee began their work on June 11, 1776.

Due to his way with words, Jefferson was chosen to pen the document's text. Isolating himself in the Graff House over a course of 17 days, Jefferson went to work. Several changes were included by the other four members before the revised broadside was presented on July 4, 1776 and adopted by the Second Continental Congress. The final paragraph of this broadside became the document we know today as the Declaration of Independence.

Following the document's adoption, Timothy Matlack was chosen as the scribe for the parchment version. Matlack's elegant penmanship was already well known due to him being chosen by Charles Thompson, Secretary for the First Continental Congress, as the scribe of the Olive Branch Petition.

Upon completion of the parchment document, the first signature to be added was that of John Hancock, President of the Continental Congress. Hancock is rumored to have said he wrote his signature as large as he did in order for King George III to read it without his glasses. The addition of Thomas McKean's signature made the collection unanimous. The actual date of his signing is unknown, but it is thought to have been sometime in 1781, due to having been "hunted like a fox by the enemy..."




Blessed is the Nation Whose God is the Lord

Here are four Bible verses that you can use for personal reflection this 4th of July:

Galatians 5:1 (Good News Translation: GNT)

Freedom is what we have—Christ has set us free! Stand, then, as free people, and do not allow yourselves to become slaves again.

Romans 6:22 (GNT)

But now you have been set free from sin and are the slaves of God. Your gain is a life fully dedicated to him, and the result is eternal life.

Isaiah 61:1 (GNT)

The Sovereign Lord has filled me with his Spirit. He has chosen me and sent me to bring good news to the poor, to heal the broken-hearted, to announce release to captives and freedom to those in prison.

Romans 8:1-2 (GNT)

There is no condemnation now for those who live in union with Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit, which brings us life in union with Christ Jesus, has set me free from the law of sin and death.
