# **Bible Study**

"Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (Jn. 8:32)

When we reflect on Independence Day, we are drawn back to the declaration that our forefathers made to fight for freedom from the oppression of England and to become our own, independent nation. We are so fortunate to live in America and to have the freedoms that are unavailable to others in various parts of the world.

Jesus spoke about freedom, but not in the same sense. Rather than speaking about being freed to do what we want (i.e., speech, bear arms, hold our own religious beliefs), he spoke of being freed from the tyranny of sin, evil, wickedness and our own delusional way of living. A selfish life does not provide lasting fulfillment.

Conversely, Jesus called us to a deeper and somewhat paradoxical truth: It is in living for others that we find fulfillment. Jesus modeled sacrificial love, which compelled him to go to Calvary and to give his life for us. As we follow the way of Jesus, we explore and discover greater truths and are prompted to pivot and apply them to how we live and interact with others.

This week, don't let your gratitude as an American citizen make our country or its ideologies and idol. Rather, worship and serve God alone, and give him thanks for the true freedom that is only found in relationship with Jesus.

### **Prayer Time**

We need to pray for our country everyday. Let the holiday remind you of the importance of praying for the following:

### Serve Others

NobleHour suggests these five great ways to volunteer on or around the Fourth of July:

- Help Keep Local Festivities Safe: They may need help setting up vendors, roping off the celebration area, manning concessions stands, assisting with parking or shuttle services, cleanup, and making sure the fireworks display runs safely.
- 2. Show Our Troops Your Appreciation: Send a letter of appreciation to troops, first responders, or veterans through Operation Gratitude. Or you can send a care kit with necessities, entertainment, and non-perishable treats like cookies or brownies. The United States Postal Service offers a free Military Care Kit that includes everything you need to send a package overseas.
- 3. Reach Out to a Local Military Family or Veteran: Being around friendly faces and meeting new people can brighten someone's day. If you need a little guidance on reaching out, an organization like Blue Star Families brings military families and their civilian neighbors together.
- 4. Organize a Neighborhood Cleanup: Make a list of supplies you'll need, like trash bags, gloves, rakes, shovels, water, sunscreen, insect repellent, and so on. A neighborhood picnic or barbecue following the cleanup is an excellent opportunity to get to know one another and show appreciation for their work.
- 5. Volunteer at a Local Homeless Shelter or Senior Center: You might serve meals, help with laundry, or support the administrative staff at a homeless shelter. At a senior center, you may volunteer to read to residents, help them with daily tasks, or simply spend quality time with residents.

### Connect: Go to the Library

The local library is a great place to visit and find out more information. Go to the library and check out the services they offer. Consider finding a book about America to read and discuss together as a family. While you are there, see what other opportunities are available to you and your family this summer.

Carve out some time to listen to worship music, hum or sing along. Here are some great songs to get you started. These songs focus on our American heritage and freedom in Christ. Look them up on YouTube if you don't have them in your music repertoire.

Pick your own songs and spend time worshipping and celebrating who God is to you and all the ways that he has blessed your life.

### Challenge: Vote!

There are things about our country that you may agree with and other things that you may have big concerns about. One of the best ways for you to influence our country and its future is through voting. Sometimes, people believe that their votes don't matter, but they do. Your individual vote may not be on the winning side of every decision, but the fact that you participate and use your voice is important, regardless of the outcome.

Check with your local state and county regarding how to register and where to vote. Mark on your calendar the various times elections are to be held (local, state, and national). Study the issues and the politicians running for office. Pray for guidance as you prepare to vote. Then, go vote and continue praying!
