By car

- Find nearby <u>parking locations</u> and redeem 2-hours' free parking at municipal lots using the HONK app and entering promo code 'CORE'

By bike or foot

- Active transportation connections are available to and through the core Dundas
 Place provides connections to the Dundas TVP and Dundas St. Bikeway
- Pedestrian access is being maintained, but some areas may be a bit uneven. Watch out for these areas and follow signs to stay on pedestrian pathways
- Enclosed bike lockers have been installed at <u>three locations downtown</u> to help provide cyclists a new, secure space to park their bike. Learn more at London.ca/cycling
