



## Searching For a New Rector

In common with many Anglican congregations across Canada, St. Andrew's is now searching for a new rector. The first step is to form a selection committee, which will have the tasks of preparing a parish profile for the congregation's consideration and then, in collaboration with the bishop, interviewing potential candidates and recommending to the bishop someone who will best serve our needs. The process will take some time and the selection committee will work as long as it takes to find the best priest to work at our parish.

Your wardens now invite parishioners to submit a letter to indicate their interest in being considered for membership on the committee. The committee should reflect the composition of our congregation, such as: long time parishioners and newcomers; working and retired folks; those who are active in the parish and know how it operates; people interested in music and liturgy; pastoral care; and so forth. Letters should clearly state why the potential member is interested and what he/she can offer.

Committee members will have to be prepared to devote enough time over the coming months to the process. As there are a number of parishes looking for rectors, it could take a while to identify a new rector.

To be workable, the wardens have been advised that a committee of not more than 8 should be struck and it should be comprised of a mix of wardens and other parishioners depending on the response to this request.
