Steeple Campaign Launch July 18, 7 pm

You are invited to a special event! On Monday, July 18, at 7 pm on the lawn by St. Luke's Church, Woodstock, the Launch of the Fundraising campaign for the Steeple Repair Project will take place. This special event marks the beginning of a program to raise \$53,000 to repair a section of damaged frame at the first roof line and replace all of the roofing on the entire Steeple structure. It also includes needed repair to a portion of the rock wall foundation of the church on the northeast corner of the structure. The program will last about thirty minutes and include information about current activities at the church, a brief review of the historical significance of the building and its contents, and an overview of the specific repairs that require immediate attention. Cold drinks will be provided. Tours of the church building will be available to anyone wishing to view the structure. We hope to see you there!!

It's early Sunday morning. The sky's crimson glow highlights the soaring clouds as they rise in the eastern sky. The river is a mirror of the shore on the other side broken only by the occasional family of ducks out for their early morning swim. The sound of a
