Invitation to Confession

Priest: Figuring out how to live in faith
can sometimes create a confusion of copious rules,
regulations, practices and prohibitions.
The reality, however, is a rather simple
“heart and soul” thing.
Loving and responding to God cannot happen apart
from loving one’s neighbour with deep compassion.
Today’s Gospel reminds us that the neighbour
might not be the one we would choose to love.
The Good Samaritan story is a cautionary tale that
catches our attention for good reason.
As we enter our celebration today,
let us prepare our hearts and minds
aware of those times we fail to love
as we are called to.
