V2: We break this bread for our broken humanity, for the powerful and the powerless trapped by exploitation and oppression and for everyone in between.

All: May there be the healing of humanity.

V1:We break this bread for those who follow other paths, different from our own.

for those that live on the periphery looking in dreaming of safety and acceptance and love.

For those who feel voiceless yearning to become equally included.

### All: May there be healing where there is pain and woundedness.

V2:We break this bread

for the unhealed hurts and wounds that lie within us all.

All: May we be healed.

Wine is poured into the cup.

V1:This is the cup of peace and of new life for all.

v2: A sign of love for the community of hope.

All: A reminder of the call to live fully, to love wastefully, and to be all that we can be.

#### **Communion -** Epiclesis

V1&2: Send, O God, your Holy Spirit upon us and what we do here, one in Christ and one in love for You and for All people—see that we and these gifts, touched by your spirit, may be signs of life and love to one another and to the world. Amen.

Bread broken...for the journey Wine poured out... for the Way.

#### **Sharing of the Bread and the Wine**

Please come forward to receive starting with the back rows. You are invited to come forward using the centre aisle. You will be given a rice cracker and a small cup of juice. Please return to your seat via the side aisles. Please wait until everyone has been served before eating and drinking. If you are online, please gather the elements you need to participate and wait until everyone has been served so we can share in communion together wherever we are located. All cups are filled with grape juice.

- V2: To eat and drink together reminds us of the deeper aspects of human fellowship, for from time immemorial the sharing of bread and wine has been the most universal of all symbols of community.
- V1: Everyone is welcome here at this table regardless of age, sex, gender, orientation, race, creed, or any other human contrived barrier. All are welcome here. The gifts of God for the people of God. Come for all is ready. You are invited to join in communion.

**Bread –** V1: Bread for the Journey. **All: Amen.** (Everyone eats together)

**The Cup** – V2: Drink for the Way. **All: Amen.** (Everyone drinks together)

Prayer after Communion: (Unison)
All: Divine Presence in all of life,

we give thanks that we have gathered together in this sacred place.

We rejoice in the giftedness of each person here. We are grateful for who we are for each other. May we continue to be truly thankful in all we do and in all we become.
