- In terms of Laodicea corresponding to an era of Church History, the end of the 19th century brought about a time of Biblical Criticism, namely the belief that scripture is not inerrant and authoritative, and thus to be interpreted loosely.
 - Also, the rise of the belief in Evolution in the 20th century meant people began to reject the biblical account of creation. When the Bible can't be trusted for how it says things began, then it can't be trusted for how it says things will end. Without beginning or end, it's all about the here and now.
- The Last Days

The Apostate church became a human institution void of true faith. As the name "Laudicea" means "people ruling," a dominant form of church government now is a democracy...the hearts of the people ruling themselves rather than being ruled by Christ. (2 Timothy 3: 1-5)
