## The “Bear” Truth

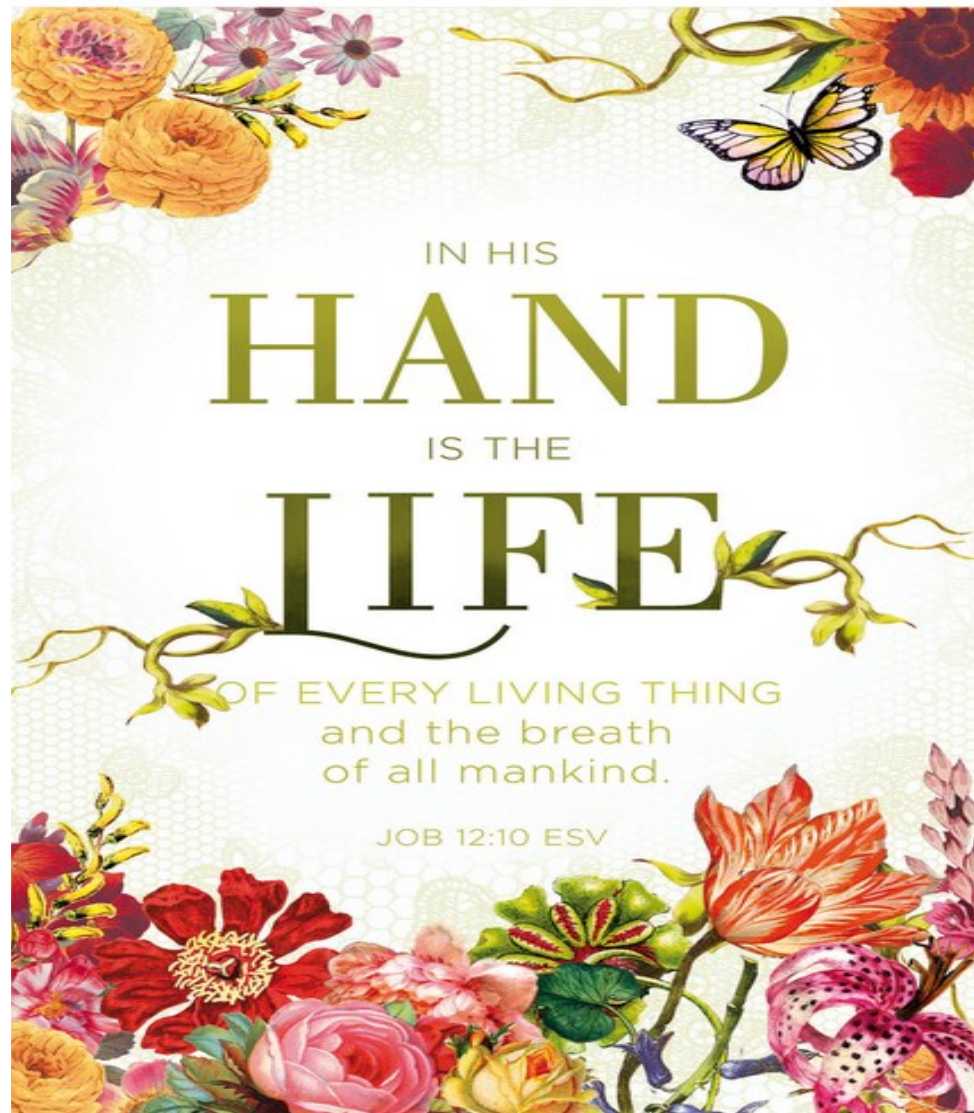
*From Chicken Soup for the Soul*

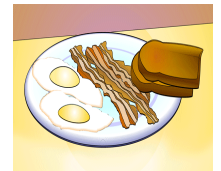
