Week 35: August 28-September 3, 2022 Celebrate The Wedding of the Ages (pt. 6)

Food to Prepare

Going on a honeymoon can be time away together near home or halfway around the world. It is fun to travel to other places, but it is not always practical to do so. Yet, in this day and time, you can bring much of the world to you. One way that you can do that is to pick foods unique to particular locations. According to Martha Stewart, here are the top honeymoon destinations for food lovers. Consider picking one, researching it, and making a spread of food related to that destination.

- 1. Oahu, Hawaii: spam musubi, boneless chicken, mahi mahi, and pineapple
- 2. Valle de Guadalupe, Mexico: tuna carpaccio, stuffed quail, pappardelle with heirloom tomatoes, fresh produce, and wine
- 3. Bologna, Italy: Bolognese sauce, tortellini, tagliatelle, cheese, meats, and wine
- 4. St. Martin: bitterballen friend meatballs, lobster bisque, escargot, and filet de boeuf
- 5. Lima, Peru: alpaca meat, corn, potatoes, and beans

Too exotic for you? No worries. Just pick a place that you would one day want to visit, look up the best foods or restaurants there, and make your own home version. If you want to go to the extra effort, decorate your table in a way that represents the culture of the location for your family meal and enjoy sharing about what you've learned with others around the table.

Bible Study

"But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body." (Philippians 3:20-21)

You have an earthly citizenship in the country you are a part of. It is what designates your national identity. With this citizenship comes opportunities and responsibilities.

Paul uses this same concept to speak about our eternal citizenship. We temporarily reside in this world, but eternally we will dwell in heaven with God. God's kingdom has already begun in the hearts of his people, but it is not fully realized until Jesus returns to establish his kingdom in its fullness. At that time, which we've called the Wedding of the Ages, Jesus will establish his dominion over all things and "bring everything under his control."

This includes us. We will live in the dominion of Jesus. He will reign over all things. He will transform our existence into glorious bodies that are eternal. We do not fully understand what this means because we've never experienced it. The closest example we have is Jesus' resurrection body. Whatever this eternal state will be, it is beyond amazing! We will dwell with God in bodies that will not break down, hurt, get sick, or die. We will spend eternity with God in heaven. Oh what a day that will be!

Prayer Time

Sometimes we can be so heavenly minded that we are of no earthly good. While it is great to anticipate and celebrate our future home in heaven, God has left us here for a purpose—to extend his kingdom on earth and into the hearts of others around us.

Spend time this week praying about the values of heaven. Consider reading through the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) and writing down these values. Then, ask God to show you times and ways that throughout the week you can extend these heavenly values in your life and in the lives of others around you.

Try to pray throughout the day as God leads you in ways to extend his kingdom on earth.

Ecological Footprint

Our global footprint is determined by what we eat, our homes, our cars, our disposal of trash, and how we live. You can do little things like turn off the lights when not using them or recycle your trash. Identify one step that you and your family can take to help preserve the world we live in. Try to commit to doing this one step for the rest of the calendar year together.

Connect: Plan a Vacation

As the fall season approaches and the school year gets underway, it can be hard to think ahead to a vacation. However, planning now for a trip over the holidays, spring break, or even next summer gives you the time to prepare financially and organizationally.

- 1. Ask everyone to think/dream about somewhere they would like to travel. Avoid putting any restrictions on the trip at this point.
- 2. Have each person research their desired destination. This includes costs to get there and back, a place to stay, food, and activities.
- 3. Have each person decide what time of year would be best to travel to his/her desired location and approximately how long he/she would desire to stay (This affects the cost.).
- 4. Take turns at dinners in the coming weeks having each person share about their desired destination and what they learned about it.
- 5. Look for common themes (even if they are in different destinations).
- 6. Identify the limitations that you have (i.e., cost, time off from work/school, availability, family responsibilities).
- 7. If possible, select a place to consider for an upcoming vacation. If not, reset and research with new parameters.
