

I grew up in a Christian home and school, and have attended Fraser Lands my whole life. While I have always considered myself a follower of Christ




After losing some relatives a few years ago, I prayed and asked God to lead me to a better future. I am thankful God

I knew about Jesus through attending church with my parents when I was a






I joined Fraser Lands three years ago through Souljourners. Finding a church community to grow with was an arduous

My parents started taking me to church at a young age. I was shy so I did not enjoy Sunday School. Every Sunday morning, my parents had to holler at me to get out


