### PASTOR'S LETTER

First off, thank you for all the prayers while I underwent hip replacement surgery. And thank you to those who helped me to and from the hospital and post-op doctor's appointments. I so very much appreciate the prayers and help.

While I have been recovering at home, I began reading a book by Father Ron Rolheiser from Oblate School of Theology here in SA. The book is called *Sacred Fire: A Vision for A Deeper Human And Christian Maturity*. I haven't read much yet, but I have found it very interesting so far.

He shares a story from another writer, Nikos Kazantzakis. It's a conversation Nikos had with an old monk. It goes like this – Sitting with the old man, Nikos asked him: "Do you still wrestle with the devil, Father?" The old monk reflected for a while and then replied: "Not any longer, my child. I have grown old now, and he has grown old with me. He doesn't have the strength . . . I wrestle with God." "With God!" exclaimed Nikos. "And do you hope to win?" I hope to lose, my child," the old monk replied. "My bones remain with me still, and they continue to resist."

I really liked this story because it reminded me of how much we speak about struggling with the devil and all the temptations we face, and how little we realize we struggle with God and being a faithful disciple. Maybe it's not so much of the devil getting in our way as it is our own human nature. But that's not exactly Fr. Ron's point for telling the story. His point is that "we struggle with different forces at various times in our lives." And all these struggles help our faith and discipleship mature through time. What we struggle with when we are young is not the same as the things we will struggle with when we are middle aged, and those are different from the struggles we face when we are old.

Now, while that is not some huge revelation, we don't always think of all the struggles we face as being spiritual, but they are—at least one facet is. Fr. Ron's opening sentences for this book are, "The human soul is like a fine wine that needs to ferment in various barrels as it ages and mellows. The wisdom for this is written everywhere, in nature, in scriptures, in spiritual traditions, and in what is best in human science. And that wisdom is generally learned in the crucible of struggle."

My question for you is- As you look back at your life, how have the struggles you have faced fermented your soul?
