

Oremus (awe-RAY-moose - Latin "let us pray"): *in our cycle of prayer this day & throughout this week, we give thanks and we pray together for the well-being of the world, the church, and for those in special need*

We give thank and we pray for peace, justice, and well-being throughout the world:
