Praise & Patter – April 2022

As we continue our journey through the Season of Lent, we are considering the Prayers of the Passion on Sunday mornings. Each week we focus on prayers offered up, either by Jesus or to him, as he made his fateful way to the cross ...

and beyond. Even two thousand years later, these prayers speak to us. On Wednesday evenings, we are using the beautiful Holden Evening Prayer as our liturgy. Each service also includes a scripture and reflection upon some of the "I AM" statements of Jesus.

Too often in this life, we tend to focus on what we want instead of what we need. What we really need is a strong spiritual foundation for our lives. When we build upon this foundation upon Jesus and who he is, everything else will be more clear. The Season of Lent is a good time for us to turn our hearts to God in prayer and self sacrifice. Some people "give up" things during Lent and others "add" a discipline to their lives. In both cases, the point is to remind us of Jesus and his sacrifice on our behalf. These practices remind us of Jesus time in the desert, tempted by Satan, and of his suffering and death on the cross.

Our spiritual needs are fulfilled through God when we accept the unconditional love he provides for us. On our own, we do not possess a full understanding of the benefits of God's redeeming love. We fall short, and need to turn to God in confidence, with an open heart to confess our sin and seek his forgiveness. When we turn to God with humble and sorrowful hearts, we can experience God's grace and unconditional love. Then, everything becomes new again. We gain a new perspective on life. And, we can strive to be ambassadors for God, faithful to the One who gave his only Son to wash away our sins.

As we slowly navigate out of a two year pandemic, the council takes time during its monthly meeting to discuss and evaluate our life together as a community. At our last meeting, we decided to implement the following changes to worship as we move forward.

First, we will begin the Sharing of the Peace on a limited basis. We will provide a brief pause between the Confession and Gathering Hymn to greet our neighbors with a handshake, a high five, or a wave from wherever we are in the room. We are not quite ready or comfortable with providing an extended time of moving around the room to greet one another. Maybe that will come in the near future. I do encourage you to share longer greetings and conversations before and after worship, or during the fellowship hour.

Second, we will once again offer Holy Communion around the table on the First Sunday of each month beginning in April. For those who would like to spend a little extra time in prayer during communion, you can receive the bread from the pastor and proceed to the rail around the table. An assistant will be there to fill your cup with wine. You are welcome to spend as much time at the rail as you like before returning to your seat by the side aisle. For now, this will only be offered on the first Sunday each month.

Third, we will bring back the tradition of having a council member serve the wine during the distribution of communion. At this time we will continue to serve one side at a time, but may serve on two sides if our in person attendance continues to grow.

Fourth, we appreciate the faithful service of the Assisting Ministers. They will continue to read the scripture and prayers. On the first Sunday of each month, the Assisting Minister will also distribute the wine around the table.

If you haven't already joined us for the Lenten journey, its not too late. Also, please make plans to be a part of worship during Holy Week and Easter. The journey from Palm Sunday to Maundy Thursday to Good Friday to Easter Sunday is powerful. We have so much to be thankful for, and making the journey to the cross and resurrection is a wonderful reminder of God's unconditional love for all of us. Jesus gave his life for our sake and he sends us forth as ambassadors of the good news in daily life so that others can share in his life. *Pastor Lee*
