Hello my new community and friends! My name is Cassandra O'Brien but you can call me Cass. I am the new director of Trinity Treasured Tykes.


I am pleased to welcome this community to Trinity Treasured Tykes. Children's happiness, security, social and cognitive development are our main objectives.

100th Anniversary of the Church Building

On March 1, 1921 ground was broken for the building of a new church structure. "How Firm a Foundation" was sung by those gathered. The program was led by the pastor-in-charge Manfred C. Wright. Divine favor on all was invoked. To end the program the pastor lifted three spadefuls of dirt to represent the Trinity. After 18 the church was completed and the structure was dedicated on October 22, 1922. Spacious rooms for church purposes, the large sanctuary, the gymnasium and the dining room were a contrast to the small building which had previously housed the congregation. The men of the church and friendly neighbors came in to volunteer time and labor to aid in he construction. A total of 100 men worked 0n the project. All the hardwood floors were laid by the men of the church. Toward the end of the work, the women came in and donated considerable time in interior decorating, cleaning and furnishing dinner for the crowd on dedication day. The first activity, even before beginning the building was an ice cream social. Two couples were married while the sanctuary was planks and timbers. Charles Cartwright and Hazel

was planks and timbers. Charles Cartwright and Hazel
Casebeer were married before the pulpit and pews were
placed. Erwin Hattendorf and Helen ReHorst walked on planks
to the altar.

From the dedication:

Surely the Lord is in this place.

This is none other than the house of the Lord.

This is the gate of heaven.

Enter into his gates with thanksgiving and into his courts with praise.
