Workshop Warm-up for Mapping Exercise Participants

Please complete the following Workshop Warm-up, as much as you are able. This Warm-up will enrich your experience and help inform your participation in the event:

- 1. Identify the traditional Indigenous territory you live in now. Who are the original, Indigenous inhabitants of the land where you are currently living? (Hint: Your municipality, parish or local educational institution may have a Territorial Acknowledgement posted online to help you answer this question.)
- 2. Identify any Indigenous land treaties governing that territory, if applicable. To search communities and treaties, go to: https://www.whose.land/en/?npi
- 3. Choose a side of your family as representative of your ancestor's arrival (or your arrival if you are a first-generation immigrant) on northern Turtle Island (Canada) and identify the traditional territory where they first settled (if different from where you were born and/or now live).
- 4. Learn which territory you were born in or have lived in, and their treaties (if different from the land where you are currently living).
