So, what is an Archdeacon?

Those who are new to the Anglican Church may not have heard this term – even some long-time Anglicans may not be sure what an Archdeacon is.

The word archdeacon is, in itself, a bit misleading. We have a number of Archdeacons in this diocese and all of them are priests not deacons! But the term is meant to imply an extra level of responsibility. In this diocese we have area Archdeacons. Archdeacons counsel clergy, give advice and support to them and to parishes in their area, and respond to parishes that are struggling in some way.

Archdeacon Elizabeth has been asked by the bishop to assist us in thinking of ways we can move on with a process that will respond to the changing nature of congregations, changing structures in this diocese, to consider what we have to offer to a new priest in this community, and to present that in a appealing way. This begins with your input.

What is Messy Church?

Messy Church is an intergenerational service that appeals to all ages. It consists of a learning time with crafts and activities for all in the beginning, followed by a kid-friendly worship service in the church, and closing with a simple dinner like pasta and salad. This means we need 8 to 10 volunteers, some in the kitchen, some working with the activities, some able to re-set tables. No really hard work is involved but a deep desire to offer opportunity for worship to those who find our regular service difficult to attend. The timing – about 5 to 7 – on Friday, means families with children can join us, learn, have fun, worship, eat, and return home with younger children ready for bed.

It is particularly appealing to Grandparents who want their grandchildren to have a connection with the church.
