- Paul lists 7 ways in verses 4-6 that he and many people today put confidence in their flesh in order to gain good standing before God:	
 Circumcised (ritual) People of Israel (race) Tribe of Benjamin (rank) A Hebrew of Hebrews (tradition) A Pharisee (religion) Zealous persecutor (passion) Blameless (legalistic righteousness)

- The greek word used in verses 7-9 is the greek word for it is used in this verse to indicate an <u>experiential knowledge</u> by personal involvement.
