AMMPARO is a holistic, whole church commitment by the ELCA, as a church in the world, to accompany children today and in the future.

The word "amparo" in Spanish means the protection of a living creature from suffering or damage. The ELCA's strategy to Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities (AMMPARO) was envisioned after witnessing the plight of children who are forced to flee their communities because of complex and interrelated reasons, including chronic violence, poverty, environmental displacement and lack of opportunities in El Salvador, Honduras and Guatemala. Due to our connection to companion churches in the region, including companion synod relationships, and existing ministries in the U.S., the ELCA is well-positioned to help ensure that these vulnerable children are protected.

In a holistic, whole church response that connects international and US outcomes, the ELCA has developed this strategy based on the following commitments:

- Uphold and guarantee basic human rights and safety of migrant children and their families;
- Address the root causes of migration in countries from Central America's Northern Triangle and Mexico and the treatment of migrants in transit;
- Work toward just and humane policies affecting migrants in and outside the U.S.; and
- Engage as a church body with all of its companions, affiliates and partners to respond to the migration situation and its causes and to advocate for migrant children and their families.

As brothers and sisters in Christ, the ELCA is called to bear witness to the conditions affecting so many communities and to work to find solutions that will acknowledge the humanity in all of God's children. Join us in making a difference in the lives of vulnerable children and families.

Changes in Collection Items for Lutheran World Relief





Effective May 1, 2020 Lutheran World Relief will no longer be accepting fleece blankets or fleece in any of their kits The fleece blankets cause environmental concerns. Lutheran World Relief encourages you to donate those to your local Charities.

The bulk soap is discontinued due to fewer requests for soap by LWR partners as this is an item that can be purchased locally. If you have large quantities of soap, those can still be used in the Personal Care kits and Baby Care kits.







11th Triennial Convention

Proposed Constitutional Changes

Voting members at our 11th Triennial Convention will be deciding on several important proposed changes to our constitutions. Many of these seek to make room for more flexibility in the way we live out our mission of mobilizing women to act boldly on their faith in Jesus Christ, some streamline our leadership structures, and some bring us into the 21st Century.

Flexibility: Instead of mandating that every woman in leadership must be a participant in a unit, proposed constitutional language encourages each leader to be a participant in a unit, (she still must be a voting member of an ELCA congregation, however.) Likewise, instead of mandating that every synodical women's organization must have clusters or conferences, proposed constitutional language encourages each synodical women's organization to foster clusters or conferences. The traditional titles for SWO leaders are sometimes intimidating to possible candidates for leadership. Proposed language offers the option of calling these leaders chairs, co-chairs, coordinators, or the like. The only SWO officer who must keep the traditional title is the treasurer, to facilitate her work with banks and other outside entities.

Streamlining: Our churchwide constitution currently mandates that SWO boards must consist of a certain set number of people, and if the SWO wants to change that number, it must submit a formal request and wait for the churchwide executive board to approve the request. Proposed language does away with that – it merely says "three or more: board members and each SWO board may make its own adjustments as circumstances require. Our constitutions currently rule out electing two women to the SWO board from any one congregational unit, proposed language allows for the election of one officer and one board member from the same unit.

Proposed changes include streamlining the churchwide board as well. Currently the board has four officers and 17 other elected members, for a total of 21; proposed language calls for four officers and 11 other elected board members, for a total of 15. These 11 members would consist of one from each of the 9 ELCA regions, plus two at-



large members. Proposed language also expands and adjusts our recommendations for diversity and inclusion so that we don't recommend fractions of people.

Many synodical organizations struggle with the process of electing voting members to triennial convention. Proposed language simplifies that thoroughly, calling for three voting members from each SWO; the president and two others. The proposed language takes into account our updated goals for diversity and inclusion in nominating and electing the members of this three-person delegation.

Into the 21st Century: We recognize that our commitment to diversity and inclusion within our organization calls for updates to our constitutions from time to time. Proposed language now encourages the inclusion of women age 45 or younger and the inclusion of members of the LGBTQIA+ community in leadership, including in the election of voting members to the triennial convention.

Proposed changes make it clear that board meeting need not involve travel. Many of us are happy to use videoconferencing (for example, Zoom, Skype, FaceTime, or the like) for meetings and the proposed changes recognize that reality.

It took a lot of work: These proposed changes grew out of the recommendations of the exploratory committee whose charge was to seek ways to help our community of women created in the image of God stay healthy and growing far into the future. Our elected churchwide board pondered and considered and amended the committee's proposals over several meetings (some by videoconference). What you see here is the result of a lot of study, a lot of thought and a lot of work. Our voting members in convention will have the final say on whether they go into effect. You are encouraged to contact the voting members to let them know your feelings about the proposed changes.
