This is a season of fulfillment:

We await and celebrate the coming of God's Kingdom with its promise of peace, of wholeness, of reconciliation, and of abundance for all. We wait for God's Kingdom to come in all its fullness.

This is a season of joyful anticipation:

God's Kingdom will be revealed, and all people will see it together. We wait expectant, attentive to all the signs of Christ coming in our midst in this time and place.
