## Review

The apostle Peter, writing to Christians who are both *elect* and *exiles*, encourages them to live faithfully...

- Praise God for Our Salvation (1:3-12)
- Set Our Hope on God (1:13-21)
- Grow in God's Word (1:22-2:3)
- Being Built Up as a Spiritual House (2:4-8, 9-10)
- Keeping Our Conduct Honorable as God's People (2:9-10, 11-12)

## No. 12 - Keeping Our Conduct Honorable, pt. 2

1 Peter 2:13-17

ESV 1 Peter 2: <sup>13</sup> Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme, <sup>14</sup> or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good. <sup>15</sup> For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people. <sup>16</sup> Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants of God. <sup>17</sup> Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor.

Our identity (2:9-10) determines our conduct (2:11-12)...

Our conduct entails a two-fold approach—stay away from (abstain) and go after (honorable conduct)...

But what does 'honorable conduct among the gentiles' look like?

'Be subject...' (v. 13)

2:18

3:1

"...to every human institution" Keeping our conduct honorable as God's people... BY being subject to every human institution (vv. 13-17) 'Be subject...' (v. 13) 'to every human institution...' (v. 13) WHY? (vv. 13-15) - because of the Lord - because of their position and purpose - because of God's will **HOW?** (vv. 15-17) - by doing good - by living as free slaves be subject...as people who are free not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil

but living as servants of God

- by relating to everyone according to their position

honor everyone

love the brotherhood

fear God

honor the emperor

## This passage (2:13-17)...

- ...is an ethical encouragement to all believers
- ...emphasizes, as a general rule, ordered living and respectful attitude toward society's authorities and standards
- ...applies universally, but most certainly looks different in different societies
- ...functions as a call for believers to live distinctively Christian lives within their societies, while prioritizing their commitment to their own Christian community

## We should approach this passage's instruction...

- ...careful to avoid undue exceptions or qualifiers
- ...out of our identity before God, first and foremost
- ...as a responsibility that will have consequences no matter what
- ...understanding that position entails treatment
