5. What's the importance of the word "so" (:16)

Pastor Tyler broke :16 into four sections. Let's look at those now.

Design. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son."

- 7. Can you think of other Bible verses highlighting God's design in salvation?

Duty. "That whoever believes."

- 8. What did Pastor Tyler mean by the word "duty"?
- 9. How does the word "whoever" affect how we share the gospel?
- 10. How did Pastor Tyler describe the difference between "belief" and "believing"?
- 11. What stuck out to you about Jesus and Nicodemus' interaction?

Look at Ch. 3:14-15

12. How does the Old Testament story connect with Jesus? What was the lesson that Nicodemus was to learn from this story?

Danger. "Shall not perish."

13. Why is this such a weighty passage?

14. Can you think of other passages that mention eternal punishment?

Destiny. "But have eternal life."

- 16. John 17:3 connects eternal life to how we know God; share your experience of knowing God.
