Solar Project Fueled by Higher Power

For Mary Jo Mettler, a trip to West Africa turned into an unexpected calling to help Phebe Hospital in Liberia get solar power.

Founded by the Lutheran church in 1921, in partnership with the Methodist and Episcopal churches, Phebe Hospital is 112 miles from Monrovia and serves approximately 450,000 patients a year.

“This is a God thing,” Mettler said. The initiative, called “PV for Phebe” (PV stands for “photovoltaic,” the process by which light is turned into electricity), aims to raise \$624,000 to provide solar energy to the hospital. Solar energy would save Phebe about \$35,000 a month on the diesel fuel it uses to run five generators.

The project recently won a \$100,000 National Geographic Great Energy Challenge Grant on the condition it be complete by September 2017.

“To make that happen, we still have a substantial amount of money to raise by December 31, 2016,” said Mettler, a former board member on the Northeastern Minnesota Synodical Women’s Organiza-

tion and current Women of the ELCA participant at Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Pine City, Minn.

Working in partnership with Minnesota-based non-profit RREAL, a non-profit that specializes in providing solar power to people of all income levels, the Northeastern Minnesota Synodical Women’s Organization-backed PV for Phebe project is hoping to bring in about \$380,000 over the \$145,364 already raised, she said

At Women of the ELCA’s Ninth Triennial Convention in 2014, voting members supported Northeastern Minnesota Synodical Women’s Organization efforts to work with RREAL project and the National Lutheran Church Women Fellowship of Liberia to develop a proposal for providing solar power to the Phebe hospital in Liberia. The PV for Phebe initiative is part of RREAL’s Skip the Grid division, which restores electrical service without having to reconstruct an expensive electrical grid, which was destroyed during Liberia’s 15-year civil war.

At the Tenth Triennial Convention and Gathering in Minneapolis in 2017, a portion of the worship offerings will go to PV for Phebe.

Cluster 4 Spring Gathering



They have a building that they opened this winter—hours are from 8 PM to 8 AM. They are closed from May to October. We also heard about the programs at the Lutheran Campus Center at Bemidji State and that they are in need of financial support. Marilyn Burmeister, WELCA President of First Lutheran Church welcomed everyone and greetings from Betty Wignes, Cluster 4 Coordinator. We all read the WELCA Purpose and Mission Statement. They have morning devotions, Bible study, and discipleship/mentoring opportunities available to those who stay with them. He also talked about the expansion project they are working on that would house more men without having to have mattresses on the floor. Rob thanked us for our support, both financially and also with our donations to their thrift store.




Cluster 10 Spring Gathering




Color, pray, explore ‘All Anew’

This series of five devotions is designed to help you prepare for the Tenth Triennial Gathering, deepening your understanding of the All Anew theme and accompanying verses. Enjoy the meditative practice of coloring as part of the devotions

Whether used in a congregational setting, at a synodical event or in the quiet of one’s home, these five devotions are important groundwork for women coming to the Tenth Triennial Gathering.

FIVE WAYS TO BUILD INTERGENERATIONAL RELATIONSHIPS

Build new multigenerational relationships Here are some ideas to celebrate the multigenerational relationships we already have and build new ones as we do Christ’s work together.

- 1. Identify entry points.** All events are opportunities for participation. Think about the advocacy projects that your group is already doing. For example, do you have a quilting group that sends quilts to Lutheran World Relief? If your quilting group meets at times that conflict with women’s schedules, work hours, nap times for small children, etc., why not reschedule to get the most participation?
- 2. Increase your visibility.** Have you thought about taking your meetings out of the church building? For example, what if you held your Bible study circle at a local café?
- 3. Accessibility is inclusion.** Is the location of your event easy to get to—even if people do not own a car? Are there events that could take place in a retirement home or in other locations? Many church buildings do not offer entrances for individuals with mobility issues, so consider this when planning an accessible location.
- 4. Look for partnerships.** Are there other ministry partners in your community and synod you could connect with? For example, is there a local campus ministry group that addresses bullying or human trafficking? When coordinating with other groups, find a time when you could have the highest participation. Ask different generations what times would best for them.
- 5. Be realistic about the level of participation.** Don’t expect newcomers to participate immediately at the same level you do. We cannot know the demands on another’s time. The object of intergenerational events is to build relationships
