## Sermon Outline — Esther 7 Sermon Series: Esther — For Such A Time As This November 27, 2022 Kelly Stanley

- + <u>Esther 7:1-2</u>, "So the king and Haman went in to feast with Queen Esther. <sup>2</sup>And on the second day, as they were drinking wine after the feast, the king again said to Esther, "What is your wish, Queen Esther? It shall be granted you. And what is your request? Even to the half of my kingdom, it shall be fulfilled. <sup>3</sup>"Then Queen Esther answered, "If I have found favor in your sight, O king, and if it please the king, let my life be granted me for my wish, and my people for my request. <sup>4</sup>For we have been sold, I and my people, to be destroyed, to be killed, and to be annihilated. If we had been sold merely as slaves, men and women, I would have been silent, for our affliction is not to be compared with the loss to the king" (ESV).
- † <u>Esther 3:13</u>, "Letters were sent by couriers to all the king's provinces with instruction to destroy, to kill, and to annihilate all Jews, young and old, women and children, in one day, the thirteenth day of the twelfth month, which is the month of Adar, and to plunder their goods" (ESV).
- † <u>Esther 7:5-7</u>, "Then King Ahasuerus said to Queen Esther, "Who is he, and where is he, who has dared to do this?" <sup>6</sup>"And Esther said, "A foe and enemy! This wicked Haman!" Then Haman was terrified before the king and the queen." <sup>7</sup>And the king arose in his wrath from the wine-drinking and went into the palace garden, but Haman stayed to beg for his life from Queen Esther, for he saw that harm was determined against him by the king" (ESV).
  - Here is a bit of trivia Ezra, the writer does here. I have told you that God is never mentioned in the Book of Esther. The final consonants of the four consecutive Hebrew words translated "that harm was determined against him" when read backward as an acrostic spell out the proper name of God,
- † <u>Esther 7:8</u>, "And the king returned from the palace garden to the place where they were drinking wine, as Haman was falling on the couch where Esther was. And the king said, "Will he even assault the queen in my presence, in my own house?" (ESV).
  - The Hebrew word translated as "falls" is [נְפֵל], nofel] and it can mean "to fall by accident; to lie down; to prostrate oneself." In other words, when the king reenters the banquet hall Haman is caught in the very act of falling—somewhere between standing upright and lying on Queen Esther's couch.<sup>2</sup>
  - The king assumes that Haman is \_\_\_\_\_\_ the queen either to take her life violently or to rape her.<sup>3</sup>
     Persian law stated that no man was allowed within "\_\_\_\_\_ " (\_\_\_\_\_ feet) of any member of the king's harem. In fact, that law also held that touching the king's wife was punishable by
- † Esther 7:8c, "As the word left the mouth of the king, they covered Haman's face" (ESV).
  - Why did they cover Haman's face? Persian law stated that a condemned man was no longer worthy to be looked upon or to look upon others. So, Haman's face was covered immediately, indicating that he was
  - According to Herodotus, a Greek historian living around the same time, Persian law required that before a person could be condemned to death, at least two serious accusations were required against that person before they could be convicted and put to death. Did King Xerxes have that? Yes! The first accusation was Haman's plot to kill the Jews -- which could be shown to be a direct threat against the \_\_\_\_\_\_\_.
