
WELCOME TO METROPOLITAN UNITED CHURCH

MUSIC NOTES

- Orlando Gibbons is one of the last of the great English Virginalists, in the lineage of William Byrd, John Bull, Peter Philips and others. His vocal music represents a high point of the English Madrigal School, with its elegantly tasteful, yet emotionally compelling text-setting tradition. *This is the Record of John* is a characteristically English genre, the verse anthem scored originally for viol consort and voices, in which the story is told in alternation by a soloist (the "verses") and the full choir (the "refrains"). The work is not without humour, e.g. the only written-out ornament in the piece occurs at the words "...and said plainly: I-I-I-I am not the Christ!"
- **Hildegard of Bingen** was a Benedictine abbess, founder of two monasteries, mystic, poet, playwright, composer, and prolific author on botany, philosophy, theology and medicine. Throughout her life she experienced visions and intense pain, which modern medicine has often interpreted to have been migraines. However, Hildegard saw these as Divine revelations, and chronicled 26 of her visions in a monumental three-volume work, the *Scivias* (1142-1151). Hildegard's music is monophonic, i.e. it consists of a solo melodic line. However, it is probable that drones and organum (parallel intervals of a fourth or fifth) were improvised in performance. Her person and works have found wide popular cultural resonance in the past few decades, among feminists, New Age thinkers, musicologists, theologians and many others.
