



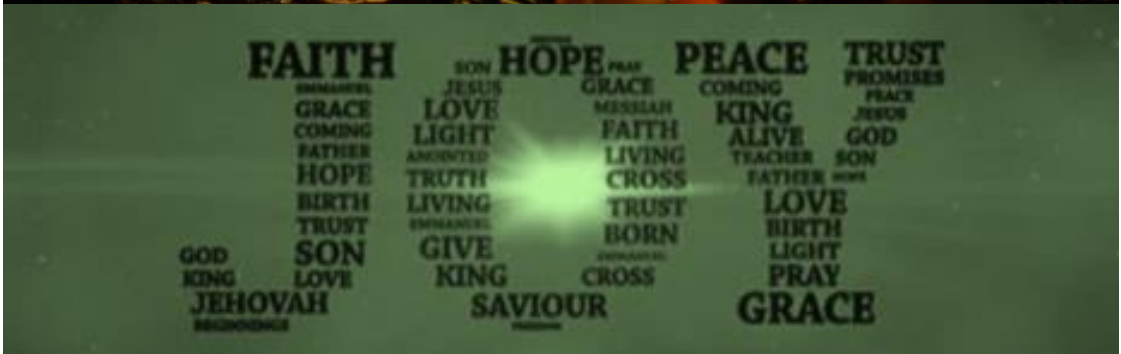

Lighting of the First Advent Candle: JOY

Reader 1: We have lit the candles of Hope and Peace, and relight them now to remind us that our hope is in Christ and that he will come again to bring peace to the world.

Reader 2: Today begins the third week in our Advent journey, and so we light the third candle, the candle of Joy. In ancient times, the prophet Isaiah said, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined." Many suffer from despair, anxiety, or holiday blues. Others experience only the dark side of human nature. Christ's light has power to overcome all dark places in our society and our souls.

Reader 1: The Psalmist tells us to "make a joyful noise to the LORD, for the Lord is God who made us and whose we are, whose steadfast loves endures forever and faithfulness to all generations." (*The first three candles are lit.*)

Reader 2: Now we light the third candle, the candle of Joy, as we remember the angel's words to the shepherds, "Do not be afraid. I am bringing you good news of great joy for all people." We light it so that all who reap blue harvests from seeds of sadness may know the joy of Jesus Christ. We light it in honor of those who show us the joy of following Christ.

Reader 1: Let us pray:

All: God of Good News, as we await your coming we give you thanks for the joy we have in Christ Jesus. May all who seek such joy find it. For all who have ceased to believe in its possibility, may you work through us to show your joy already present. Come, God of Joy, come. Amen.

The Gathering of the Community

Celebrant: (*BAS pg. 185*) The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

People: And also with you.

Celebrant: Almighty God,
All: to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hidden. Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Celebrant: (pg. 270) God of power and mercy, you call us once again to celebrate the coming of your Son. Remove those things which hinder love of you, that when he come, he may find us waiting in awe and wonder for him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.
All: Amen.

Affirmation of Faith: God's Rule of Grace

Celebrant: Let us affirm our faith, as we say

- Leader: In joyful expectation let us pray to our Saviour and Redeemer, saying, "Lord Jesus, come soon!" O Wisdom, from the mouth of the Most High, you reign over all things to the ends of the earth: come and teach us how to live.

- Leader: O Lord, and head of the house of Israel, you appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush and you gave the law on Sinai: come with outstretched arm and ransom us.

- Leader: O King of the nations, you alone can fulfil their desires. Remembering all those in the St. Paul's Cycle of Prayer and the Anglican Cycle of Prayer (*names at the back of the bulletin*). Cornerstone, you make opposing nations one: come and save the creature you fashioned from clay.
- All: Lord Jesus, come soon!**
- Leader: O Emmanuel, hope of the nations and their Saviour: come and save us, Lord our God.

Mental Health Highlight for Dec 11

You've probably heard of First Aid training, but do you know about Mental Health First Aid or Psychological First Aid?

Mental Health First Aid is a training course designed to give the public skills to help someone who is experiencing a decline in their mental well-being or a mental health crisis. The evidence demonstrates that it builds mental health literacy, decreases stigmatizing attitudes, and helps individuals identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illness. Psychological First Aid equips learners in developing a personal understanding of the effects of stress, loss, trauma and grief on others, with emphasis on self-care and personal protection. Learners are introduced to the Red Cross' Look, Listen, Link, Live model—a resiliency-building approach to emotional, psychological, and social wellbeing that teaches learners how to support themselves and others to cope with the effects of various types of stress.
