

Main Text: Luke 2:8-20

Luke 2:15 (NLT) - "Let's go see this thing that has happened ..."

Those who nurture a seeker's heart will most likely encounter God, in the Christmas season and well beyond.

How does one nurture a seeker's heart?

## 1. Prioritize via action/movement.

Luke 2:16 (NLT) - They hurried to the village and found Mary and Joseph. And there was the baby, lying in the manger.

## 2. Elevate worship.

Luke 2:20 (NLT) - The shepherds went back to their flocks, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen. It was just as the angel had told them.

## 3. Be generous with what you find.

Luke 2:17 (NLT) - After seeing him, the shepherds told everyone what had happened and what the angel had said to them about this child.

1 Samuel 3:3-4 (NLT) - The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was sleeping in the Tabernacle **near** the Ark of God. <sup>4</sup> **Suddenly** the LORD called out, "Samuel!"

Proximity to God's presence prepares for the "suddenlies" of God.

## Study Guide

Can you think of an area of your life that has required you to diligently seek out a solution? What actions were required to create the reality you were after? (This could be things like: a healthier body, improved relationships, a more fulfilling career, retirement plans, etc.).

What parallels can you see regarding a deeper, closer walk with God?

What are some practical steps that you can take to nurture your relationship with the Lord?

Review the main scripture from Sunday (Luke 2:8-20) and look for the shepherd's response to the Good News. How did they reflect the heart of seekers?

The shepherds' actions were described in Sunday's message:

They 1) prioritized their seeking of God via action/movement (Luke 2:16), 2) elevated the importance of worship in their lives (Luke 2:20), and 3) generously shared with others what they had found (Luke 2:17).
