

Officiant: Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us eternal life. Amen.

A Prayer of Saint Chrysostom



Benediction


Officiant: Let us bless the Lord.
